Dr. Stockard's paper was one of three presented. The others were Dr. Samuel W. Lambert's on "The medicinal use of alcohol in the acute in fectious diseases," and Dr. Harlow Brooks on "the medicinal use of alcohol in the diseases of the aged."

Dr. Lambert, who is president of the New York Academy of Medicine. described alcohol as "a food of high caloric value. As a drug, he said, it is a necessity in the treatment of acute infectious fevers. 

Freud Believes Religion is Dying

No Longer Able to Guide Man Toward Moral Perfection. Says Psychoanalyst

Worried About America

Bedlin-In his new book, "The Future of an Illusion," Sigmund Freud, founder of psychoanalysis, attempts to show that the days of reit. gious education are numbered and that religion is no longer able to guide mankind toward moral perfection

Religion, according to Freud. mere illusion. Gods, he says, were created by man. Psychoanalysis, he asserts, has spread the knowledge of this in widening circles. Nevertheless, he declares, this knowledge is dangerous.

"As long as the oppressed masses could be maintained in the belief." he says, "t'hat one still believes in God. everything was all right. But they certainly will learn that one does no more. An outburst of anti-social passions will be the consequence. It a man refrained from killing his neighbor for the sole reason that God has forbidden killing and will avenge it. he undoubtedly will kill him as soon as he learns that there is no God and that his punishment is not to be

The remedy to this, Freud thinks, is a new system of education which will teach morals without referring to divine justice, punishment or reward. The child must be taught, he says, not to fear God, but to regard the welfare of society as the supreme and of ! individual life.

Two countries seem to captivate the old scholar's attention as he sets forth his rather casual ideas about relgion: One is Russia, and the other America.

In Russia some of Freud's theories have already been put into practice. All public education there is irreliglous, and attempts have been made in Moscow and elsewhere to apply pay chonalysis as a method of educating normal youth. Freud admires Russia's effort to reform education but he does not think that Russian met cd: could be applied in oher European countries.

Freud is aware that the future of mankind largely depends on America, but he seems somewhat alarmed by America's attitude toward "science." In Freud's opinion, this attitude is embedied by the Dayton trial. Fraud is ironical about "God's own country and he deplores the prederinance of religion in American public life.

The total for 1927 is made up of the following items: wheat, \$452,602,000; oats, \$231,295,000; barley, \$63,668,600; rye, \$12,668,500; flaxseed, \$7,379,000; other grains (peas, beans, buckwheat, mixed grains and corn for husking, \$47,752.000; potatoes, \$56,279,000; have and clover and alfalfa, \$201,215,000; root and fodder crops (turnips, etc., grain hay, fodder corn and sagar beets) \$68,508,000.

For the three prairie provinces-Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta -the total value of the five principal grains are as follows? wheat, \$419 .-969,000; oats, \$127,118.000; barley, \$47,492,000; rye, \$10,894,000; flaxseed. \$7,173,000.
