

Winnipeg .- An interim payment on wheat and flax amounting to \$28,-000,000 is being received by members of wheat pools of Manitoba, Saskatchewan and Alberta, and the Coarse Grain Pools of Manitoba and Saskatchewan. In making the announcement of this distribution, E. B. Ramsay, manager of the Central Selling Agency, said that the Canadian pools now have paid out more than 1923, when the first pool was started

in Alberta. The pools handled more than 185, 000,000 bushels of wheat during the crop year 1927-28, Mr. Ramsay said. This is about 6,000,000 bushels more than was delivered by the three provincial pools of the Central Selling Agency during the previous crop year
