

Air Expedition Sails to Papua For Sugar Cane

Object Is To Find Species Superior to That Grown Now on United States Soil

Financed By Government

Experts Say Island Is Original Home of the Product

A new airplane expedition to the wilds of Papua, New Guinea, got under way recently when the freighter Atholl sailed with a Fairchild monoplane lashed to her after deck.

This is the second expedition by aircraft to the virtually unknown interior of New Guinea. The first was that conducted by Dr. Matthew W. Stirling, to study a race of pygmies in the Nassau Mountain region.

According to scientists New Guinea is the original home of the sugar cane, and it is the only spot in the world where the cane can be made to grow from seed.

Aboard the Atholl, which is one of the British-owned American and Australian line freighters, was Richard Kenneth Peck, civilian flyer employed by the expedition. He will accompany the plane to Sydney, Australia, which is about 2,000 miles from New Guinea.

Peck, who was one of the pilots of the Stirling expedition, is thirty-two years old. He received his training in commercial flying and has 2,000 hours in the air to his credit. His home is in Elgin, Ill.

The expedition will make its way up the Fly River, which was first discovered by white men when the British destroyer Fly entered it in 1895.

The expedition is expected to be gone about six months. The trip from New York to Sydney will be made in forty-five days. Early expeditions to New Guinea have taken from eighteen months to two years in forcing their way into the country.

Spring, summer, autumn and winter come each year to practically all of the States. But out here in Newark, Ohio, we now and then feel that they have mixed their dates.

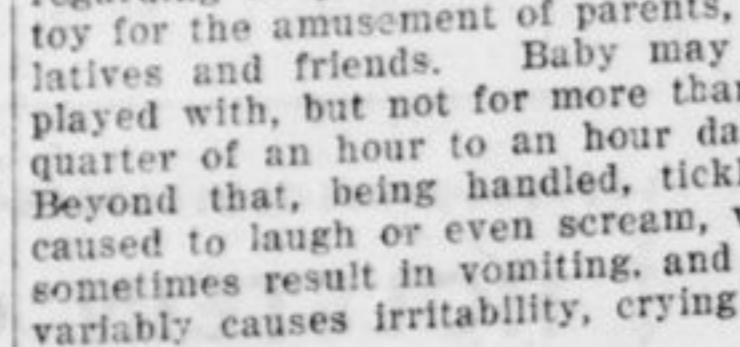
Spring, summer, autumn and winter come by and visit us every year as a rule. And we say without fear of successful contradiction the latter part of June is quite cool.
