---Controlling Cutworms

(Experimental Farm Note.) The cutworm is a serious menace to the tobacco grower in his efforts to obtain a uniform stand of tobacco from the first planting. These insects are found in practically all soils, but are usually more numerous in sod fields The plants are cut off near the quality. Put up only in surface of the ground, and in many cases several replantings are neces- packages. sary in order to secure a uniform stand of tobacco.

Cut worms can be fairly well controlled by fall plowing before the 20th of September, at which time the moths have stopped laying their eggs, and also but the use of poison bran mixture. The poison bran mixture, which has proven most satisfactory on the Experimental Farm at Harrow, Ont., for a period of years, contains 1 pound of Paris Green and 50 pounds of wheat bran mixed dry. These are mixed together with 1 gallon of cheap Molasses and sufficient water to give the mixture the consistency of wet sawdust. This should be broadcast over the field by hand one or two evenings before planting the tobacco, The best results have been obtained broadcasting it over the field on two Milk of Magnesia in water. 
