'Co-operative Marketing'

This practical topic was most fluently and lucidly handled at the U. F. O. Co-operative meeting in Priceville Saturday, by H. A. Gilroy, the special speaker of the day. He was glad that contract farms had not previously been printed, as was complained of because the pressure salesmanship was desired to induce men to sign. He related the origin of the Co-Operative Co. and its early losses. The pool system has been applied to eggs; live stock can be treated similarly. In times of rising markets, he said, the co-operative business falls away; in a prolonged depression the receipts mount up. One cause of loss in rising market, is that the drover is very busy and preys upon the farmer. This barnyard fixing of values, as made by the drover, is the curse of co-operation. The contract system was made to get greater bargaining power.
