Pacific Ry. to Heron Bay on Lake Superior and south of main line of Canadian National Ry.—Oct. 29 to Nov. 25 inclusive; north of Lake Nipissing and the French river and south of Canadian Pacific main railway line to Heron Bay—Nov. 1 to Nov. 25 inclusive except in District of Algoma, season is Nov. 19 to Nov. 25 inclusive South of French and Mattawa Rivers Nov. 5 to Nov. 29 inclusive. Special Hunters' trains leave Toronto 10.00 p.m. for Sudbury Nov. 1, 2 and 8. For information as to best localities, game laws, train service, etc., consult nearest Canadian Pacific agent.
