Thomas Henderson, Durham, builds Successful Business in Small Community

(From Baker and Confectioner) THE LAWLOR SHIELD offered at the 1928 Convention of the Bread and Cake Bakers' Association of Canada for a six pound dark Fruit Cake was won by Mr Thomas Henderson.

Alert for New Ideas Mr Henderson puts great stress on changing the contents of these trays frequently. He watches the lines carefully and if anyone does not move quickly, he drops it and substitutes something else.

Modest over his prize Cake Mr Henderson has not much to say about his prize winning mixture. He has been making it for many years and varies it very seldom.

22 years in Canada Twenty two years ago, Thos. Henderson came to Canada from his native health, Scotland, well qualified to practice his trade.

Essence of Cleanliness Mr Henderson has not fallen into this rut. His store front is very small but it is conspicuous from the use of white paint both within and without.

Mr Henderson has little competition from the grocery stores which sell cakes brought into Durham from outside points, but he has to meet a good deal of competition and price cutting from bread lines.

When the writer saw Mrs Henderson's window, it showed some decorations and small baskets filled with appropriate confections.
