Sister Province To Play Big Part

Professor Goforth Points to Development of Northern Areas

BIRTH RATES AID

French Destined to Become Predominant in the Dominion

Quebec .- "The Province of Quebec is destined to play an important and leading part in peopling the accessible but still unsettled regions of the Dominion," Prof. W. W. Goforth, assistant professor of Economics and Political Science at McGill University, told a large audience recently in the Chateau Frontenac, in the course of a lecture outlining the province's re-

cent progress. "Quebec Province is now growing numerically, and will probably continue to grow more rapidly than the average rate of growth throughout Canada for the past 60 years," said Professor Goforth. "There are sound reasons for presuming that within two generations the population of Canada will be predominantly French in racial origin, and that the French language and culture will prevail over a wider area and over appreciably as great a community on this continent as in

QUEBEC'S BIRTHRATE GROWS "It is not only that the rate of population growth in this province is more rapid than that of any other province in the Dominion, but that while other provinces in keeping with the prevailing trend in Europe and America, hav shown declining rates of natural ineranse, negligibly supported by immigration, Quebec has more than maintained its previous high ratio of births over deaths. The average annual rate of natural increase in Quebee during the decade 1917-26 was 19.86 per thousand, as against 19.51 per thousand in the preceding 10-year poriod. If we take the five-year average of 1922 26 we find a still higher ratio of 19.06 per thousand, as against 18.1 in the five-year period 1907-11. The significance of this condition is only realized when it is compared with the average rate of growth of the thousand)."

The speaker paid a tribute to the conservative principles upon which the business life of the province is found-

"The economic growth of French Canada was less startling during the prosperous pre-war years than that of Ontario and the Western Provinces, but that it was sounder is pretty clearly shown by its earlier and more rapid recovery from the financial and industrial collase of 1920. It is this postwar economic advance of Quebec which has attracted such wide attention, not only in the Dominion, but in the United States and elsewhere, and has brought to the province a larger investment of domestic and foreign capital than it enjoyed during the preceding two decades.

GEOGRAPHY AND POPULATION. "Among other conditions which brought this transformation, two stand out prominently, the first concerns geography and the second population. During the past eight years, from a limited civilization built up along the shores of the St. Lawrence of agricultural, fishing and lumbering communities, and a few important manufacturing and commercial centres, the economic life of this province has spread northward with great rapidity, and has added to its effective resources a volume and variety quite


