More Garden Hints Foliage Screens

Garden Editor Gives Some Good Advice on General Topics in this Week's Issue

Too often the average garden leads up to a high board fence, garage, or chicke.. house, which, no matter how bright the display of flowers, looms up prominently from every angle. Such a disfigurement is not at all necessary, and it can often be turned to advantage. Where the gardener is the owner of the property, permanent screens can be trained over these affairs by utilizing Boston ivy, Virginia creeper, Dutchman's pipe, wild clematis, and similar perennial vines. Even the person who expects to move next year can hide any unsightly background by using morning glories, wild hops, scarlet runner beans, sweet peas, Dolichos Lablah or hyacinth bean, which will grow rapidly, providing foliage and flowers to cover anything they are attached to. Sweet peas and morinng glories can only be used on smaller buildings or fences, as they will not grow much over five feet, but the others named will run up to twenty feet, the hyacinth bean doing this easily and providing an abundant show of white, purple andd lilac flower spikes as well. For a standing screen, such as is necessary in front of a poultry fence or between gardens where there is no fence, sunflowers, cosmos, African marigolds, larkspur, dahlias and glant hollyhocks may be used. To thicken up some of the climbers, such as the scarlet runner beans, use climbing nasturtiums, which will benefit from some support.

Hints On Pruning This is the month for pruning in the small garden and larger place too. All of the dead canes should be removed from the raspberry patch as well as the spindly ones among the new growth. Some of the older wood should be cut away from the gooseberries and currants. Grapes must be pruned early to avoid excessive bleeding These vines should be cut back to a mere skeleton as the fruit is borne on the wood grown this year. Fruit trees should be opened up to let in sunlight and air In pruning roses, one should remember that ordinarily the flowers are borne on theh to many per plant; otherwise small, weak stems and inferior flowers will result. Pruning of the hybrid perpetappearing. Cut each cane back to six or eight buris from the ground, alw ys cutting pust above a bud point ing outward. The weaker growing hybrid teas are pruned more severely. If size and high quality of flowers are sought, al but five shoots are cut to the base, and each of these remaining five is cut back to three or four buds.






