#### Sunburn Meter is Newest Invention

Outstanding Scientific Achievement Announced in New York .

New York, June 14 .- (A.P.) --Creation of a sunburn meter, an outstanding scientific achievement, was announced last night to the New York Electrical Society by Dr. H. C. Renschler, director of research for the Westinghouse Lamp Company.

The meter uses a photo electric cell to make an automatic written record and measurement of the presence of ultra-violet rays, the invisible wave length of light that causes sunburn.

These same rays possess curative powers, which have come into such lamps, that recently medical authorities have broadcast warnings against overdoing.


