Wheat and Wool

Calgary Herald (Ind. Cons.): (The wheat crisis shows the danger of undiversified farming. Why not produce wool as well as wheat?) The Dominion imports every year about 16,000,000 pounds of wool, chiefly South American and New Zealand fleeces, which are generally cheaper substitutes for the higher-priced Canadian fleece. There is no obvious reason why this country could not produce the 28,000,-600 pounds of wool required for home uses, and the western provinces are the logical territory for the increased production. It is claimed on the authority of Government experts that on the prairies we have every advantage for the successful raising of sheep. We have comparative freedom from sheep diseases common to other parts of the continent. We are virtually immune from the majority of physical complaints which affect sheep due to a lack of noxious vegetation and to healthy climatic circumstances. Ou cost per capita of sheep raising is to finitely less than the reported cost of any state in the American Union.
