

Fortunately, his car plunged in the right direction, for, despite the time lost, he finished second in the race.

Racing Without Steering Louis Hornbrook, of Ithaca, has the distinction of being the only driver, in his memory, to complete a full lap at top speed with his steering gear out of commission and finish among the first three. He stated that that was thrilling enough. Myron Fults, whose home is in Syracuse, hasn't had any "real" accidents, but he admits having crashed through several fences without being hurt. Freddie Frame, of Los Angeles, who broke the half mile record for a dirt track in Canada, doing that distance in 28 4-5 secands on the opening day of the meet in Toronto, turned over a number of times on a track in Texas, his car landing just a few feet in front o hundreds of spectators. He biamed the heavy dust for this catastrophe.
