As reported by a correspondent of the New York Times, the unnamed star is of the thirteenth magnitude. The temperature of its ray is described in the announcement only indirectly by a comparison, which states:

"This exploit becomes even more impressive when it is realized that a star of the sixth magnitude, that is, one which can barely be seen with the unaided eye, radiates upon the North American Continent no more heat than the sun radiates upon one square yard of surface. Yet in the case of such a star, the thermo-couple will show that the increase in heat on account of it is one-half of one millionth of a degree Fahrenheit, and that the electric current generated thereby is about one twenty-bil-Month of an ampere.

"This value becomes intelligible in consideration of the fact that the Hight in an ordinary incandescent house light is produced by a current of from one-fourth to one ampere.

"The extreme sensitiveness of the theromo-couple is again illustrated in the case of stars as they rise above the horizon. The higher they ascend, the brighter they appear, because the higher they rise the less of earth's atmosphere their rays are obliged to penetrate, and consequentb, the less their rays are absorbed.

"The sensitivity of the thermocouple is so great that with bright stars near the horizon the change in brightness which takes place in one minute of time can be detected."




