Sunday School Lesson

December 21. Lesson XII—Timothy (The Influence of Home Training)—Acts 16: 1-3; Philippians 2: 19-22

Introduction—There is nothing finer in the New Testament than the friendship of Paul and Timothy. The Bible makes this contribution of several others to the story of great friendships, for example, Abram and Lot, David and Jonathan, Jeremiah and Baruch.

Paul's references to Timothy in his letters to the churches as well as his letters to Timothy himself, show how highly he regarded his younger friend, his "beloved and faithful child in the Lord."

The town of Lystra was in the province of Lycania in the south-eastern parts of Asia Minor. It was one of the places visited by Paul and Barnabas on their first missionary journey (Acts 14: 6-18) and it was there in all probability that Timothy first heard the gospel preached.

This letter is believed to be the last written by Paul. He was for the second time a prisoner in Rome (A.D. 63 or 64) the letter contains "the outpouring of the apostle's heart, when he felt his death to be imminent, to one who had been his faithful companion and assistant for many years."

III. PAUL'S APPRECIATION OF TIMOTHY, Philippians, 2: 19-22.

In his letter to the Christian community at Philippi, written from Rome during his first imprisonment, Paul bears very high testimony to the character of Timothy. He was hoping to send Timothy on the long journey to Philippi that he might bear messages and bring him back word of their welfare.

It must have been to Paul a great comfort in his long imprisonment (Acts 28: 16, 30) to have at hand so true and loyal a friend, a friend who had the same interests deeply at heart, who really cared for the things he cared for and absolutely to be relied upon.

Steak and Kidney Pie, English Style.

Remove crusts from four slices bread. Spread with butter and cut each slice in three pieces of uniform size. Drain the juice from 2 cups of cooked peaches.

One sup sugar, 2 eggs, 1/2 cup sweet milk, 1/2 cup shortening, 1 1/2 cups flour and 3 teaspoons baking powder. Mix in order given. Bake in moderate oven. Flavor with cinnamon, etc. to own taste. I use several kinds myself.

Spanish Cake

Green peppers, onions and tomatoes cooked together slowly in a casserole and seasoned with salt, pepper and butter, make an appetizing dish for cold weather.

Cold-Weather Dish

One cup cooked prunes, 1 cup cooked apricots, 1 1/2 cup sugar, 2 tablespoons flour, 1 tablespoon butter, 1 spoon lemon juice, prune and apricot juice. Cut prunes and apricots into pieces and mix with sugar and lemon juice. Line tin with pastry and cover with fruit. Pour on fruit juices. Put with butter and dredge with flour. Dot on top crust and bake.
