Death came Friday Feb. 6, as a shock, to the many friends of the late John Ellis of Toronto, formerly of con 16, Egremont.

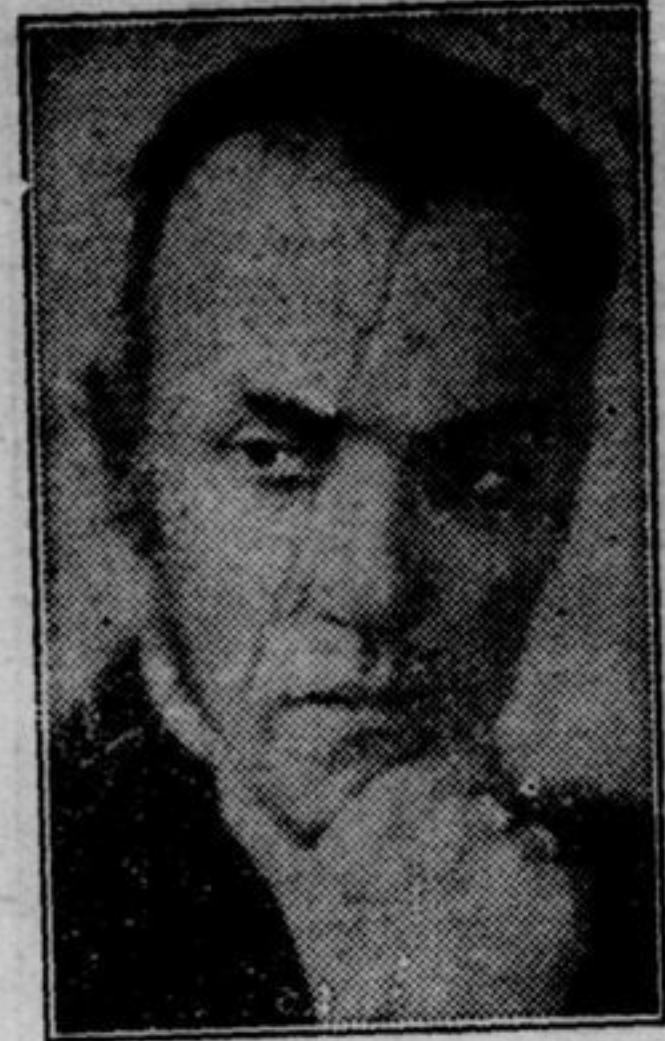
