The enormity of the offence of the eleven members who refused to vote was blazoned in the daily press from coast to coast but not their complete vindication which came later.

In 1927, the Canadian rules were revised, adopting Standing Order No 1, which states: "In all cases not provided for hereinafter or by Sessional or other orders, the usages and customs of the House of Commons of Great Britain and Northern Ireland as in force at the time, shall be followed so far as they are applicable to this House."
