Include Some of These The real vegetable garden consists of very much more than a few rows of carrots, beets and beans. There is room here for just as much variety and interest as we have in the growing of flowers. The Canadian climate almost everywhere lends itself admirably to the production of a great wealth of vegetables, and our seasons usually favor quick growth which is absolutely essential for the highest quality. Among the lesser known vegetables of the cabbage type we have Red Cabbage, Chinese Cabbage, Broccoli, Kale and Brussels Sprouts. Red Cabbage is far more desirable for pickles and salads than its white sister. Chinese Cabbage, a sort of a cross between Lettuce and Cabbage, has a very delicate flavor. Broccoli resembles Cauliflower. Incidentally, the latter vegetable might be grown more universally in this country also as i is among our highest class. ### Surgeon Declares Drug Addicts Worth Saving

Commenting upon the question which is simetimes raised as to whether or not drug addicts are worth reclaiming, Surgeon-General Hugh S Cumming of the United States Public Health Service recently stated that drug addict prisoners who have committed offenses against the United States and who are no longer taking drugs, show, according to preliminary studies of the Public Health Service, a greater proportion of above average intelligence than is observed among

non-addict prisoners. Among the drug addicts studied thirty in every one hundred were above average in intelligence, whereas eighteen in every one hundred prisoners not addicted to the use of drugs were above the average in intelligence. On the other hand, seventeen in every one hundred drug addict prisoners were considered to be norone in every ten addict prisoners were mentally defective.





He went to Gibraltar as Governor in 1762 and died there in 1776, being buried at Guiford Parish Church, near Bury, St. Edmunds. If you ask the average person to name the different breeds of dogs he knows he usually mentions - about twelve. Canadian Kennel Club recognizes eighty-four varieties. Some of them, of course, are very scarce. They are seldom seen.
