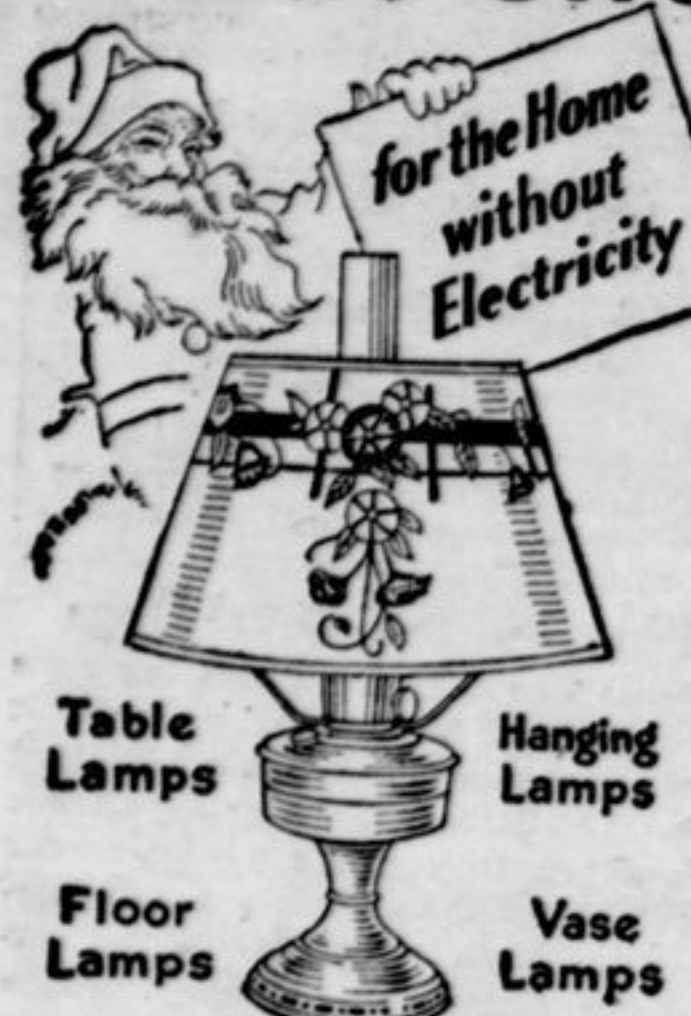


A NEW PUZZLE CONTEST

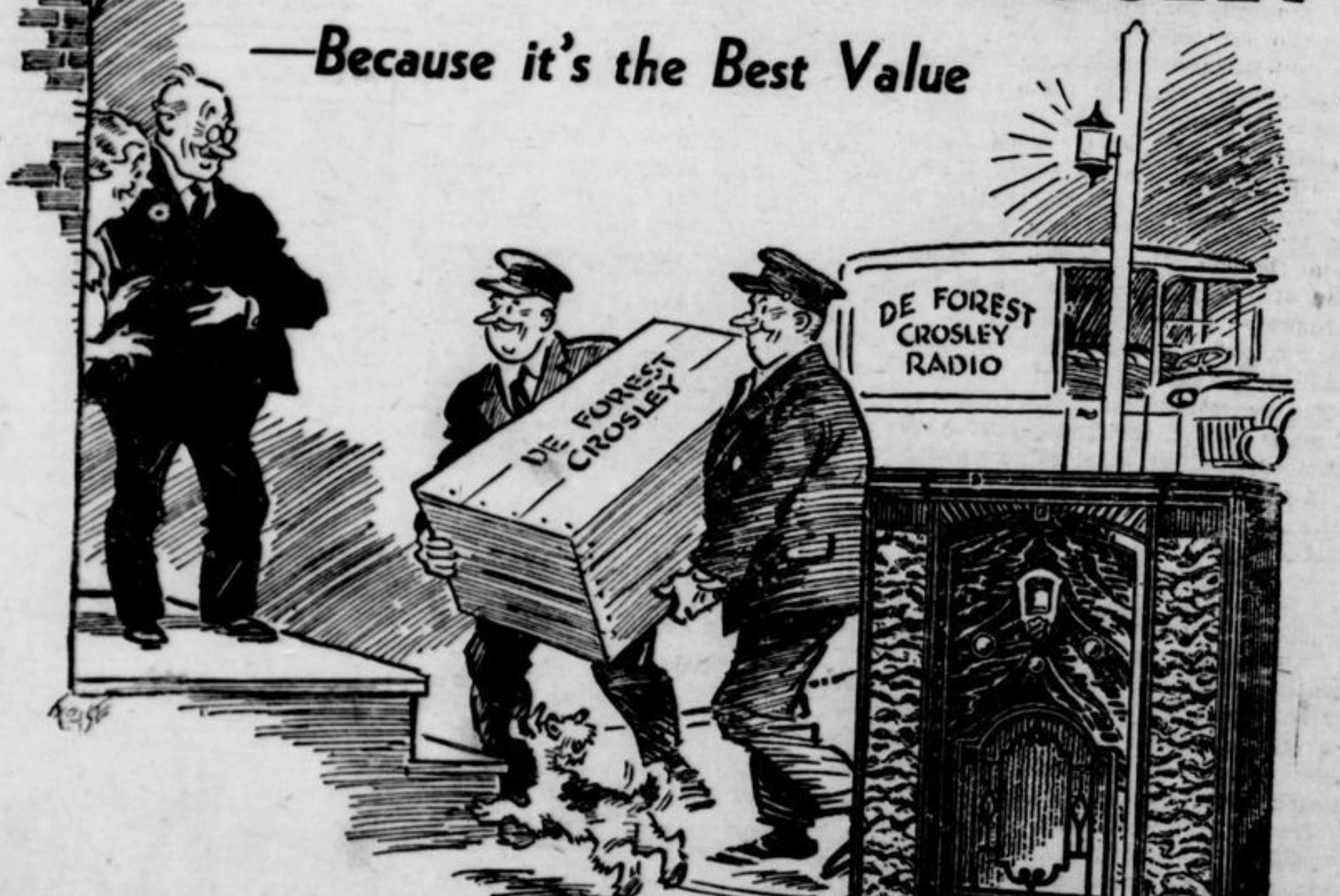
