

Canada Silk Industry

For five years in succession the silk industry of Canada has shown increases in the value of production. Even in 1930, a year of slackened trade generally, the output of the silk industry rose by over 20 per cent. Silk manufacturing is one of the newer industries of the Dominion and the rapidity of its growth has been remarkable. Records are available since 1917, and in the intervening period the value of production has risen by over

650 per cent. The growth of the industry has been well sustained throughout the 13 years, although there have been some fluctuations. In 1917 the value of production was \$2,372,000. By 1920, when prices were at their height, it had risen to
