Agricultural Society had Poor Year Financially

The annual meeting of South Grey Agricultural Society, held Wednesday afternoon, was not largely attended, but those present were active workers for its progress. Pres. John McGrath presided. While 1931 was a record breaking year for entries, and for exhibits Durham was the best fair in the locality, yet gate and concert receipts fell almost \$200, and the Directors were unable to meet the increased prize list, when awards amounting to over \$700 were taken. The management decided on paying only 50 per cent. of prizes to exhibitors, and this cut still leaves them with a deficit of \$70.

There is a danger that Government and County grants may be materially reduced or withdrawn, and should such come to pass, it would necessitate new sources of revenue, or abandonment of the fair.
