Judges Rebuke Hatless Women

British Magistrates Order Them to Cover Their Heads in Court

British judges seem to be united in maintaining court etiquette, at least to the extent that women must wear hats in court. Several cases of uncovered women in court have recently been noted in the London press, on account of the transgressors being reprimanded by the magistrates and variously commented on.

First, a woman was not allowed to take the oath in Coventry police court because she was not wearing a hat, but the most sensational case was at Aldershot, where Brig. Gen. S. Lushington, chairman of the Aldershot Bench, asked a hatless girl witness: "Do you possess a hat?"

"Yes, but I don't wear it, when it's so hot, she replied."

General Lushington then said severely: "Let me tell you this is the first time anybody has presented herself before me wearing no hat. It is an insult to the court and a disreputable proceeding, and the way you have given your evidence shows you are a person of extraordinarily light and foolish mind."

"I wish you to understand that if you are coming to the court again you must appear properly dressed and in a respectable manner. This court is not going to be treated in this way, and I hope you are thoroughly ashamed of yourself for the way you have come here and the way in which you have given your evidence. The court will disallow your expenses."

So far, hatless women in court have the endorsement of the London press: "Just a matter of court etiquette," says one paper. "There is no law which required that the oath must be taken by a woman with head covered."

Another comment reads: "An insult to the court the lady's conduct may have been. After all, the court itself knows best when it feels insulted. But that she was guilty of 'a disreputable proceeding' is another matter. Even in the High Court of Justice a woman has appeared bare-headed and unprimed. During the recent heat wave a woman magis- trate actually dispensed justice with- out a hat."

A Home Office official remarked: "The wearing of hats by women in courts of law is purely a matter of custom and courtesy."

Dr. D. Knight of the Women's Free- dom League said: "Magistrates should get on with their job and stop making impertinent remarks about women's clothes."

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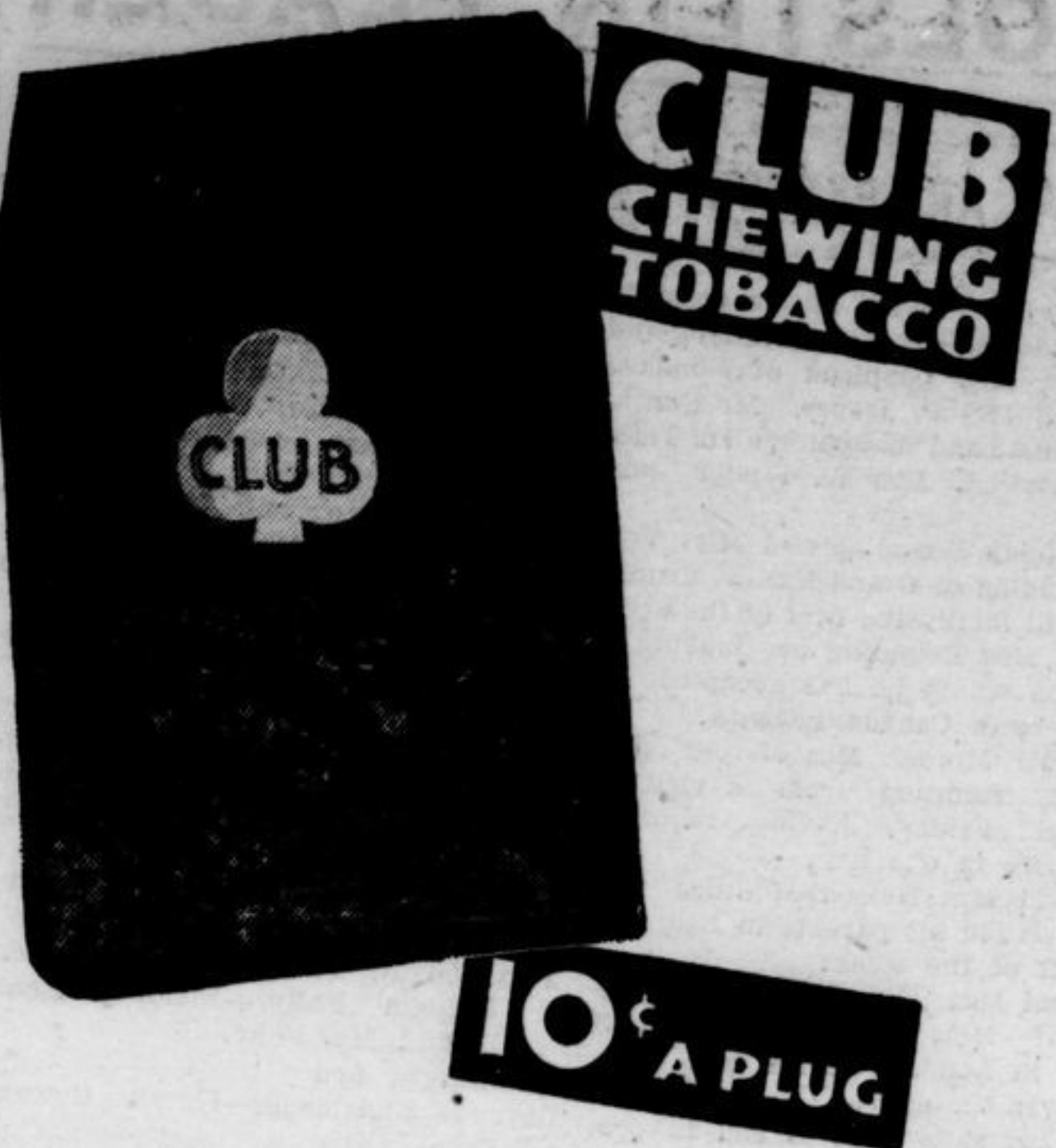
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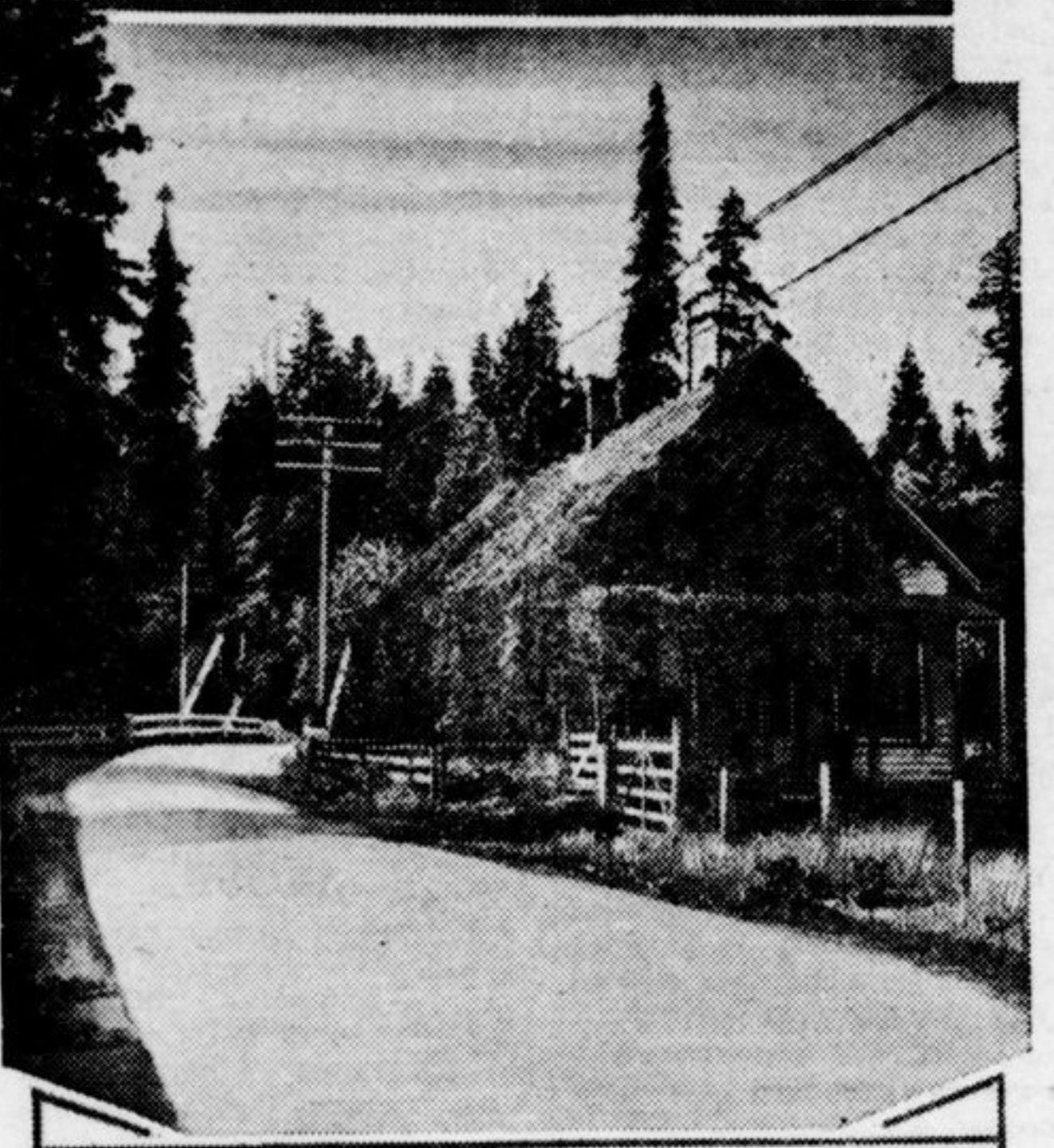

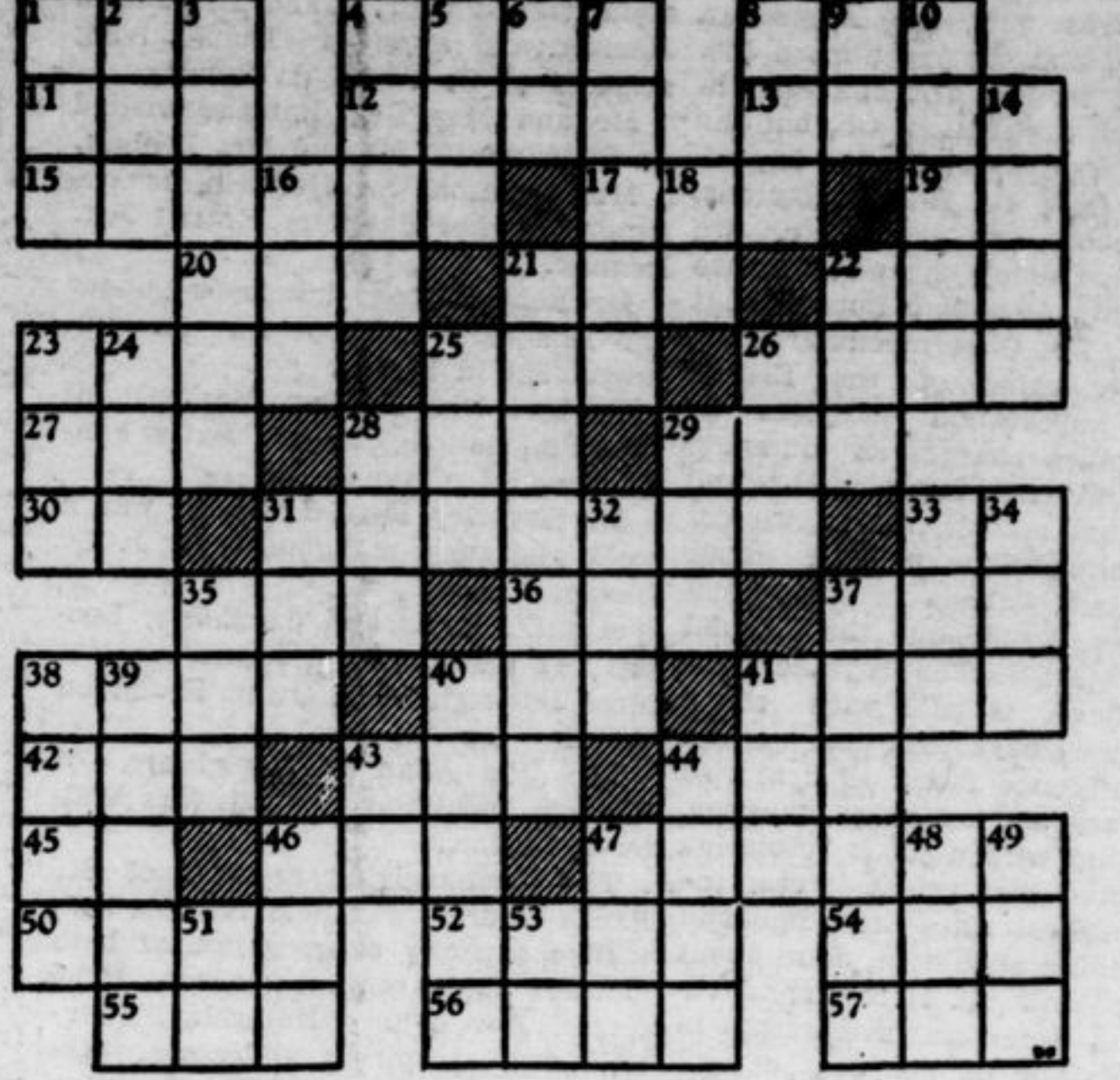
