Soap Suds For Fire-Great est Ocean Depths-Gold on the Rand

Why does water put out fire? That water is wet is no answer at all. Theoretically water ought to be decomposed into its constituent hydrogen and oxygen. In fact this actually does happen when fires are very hot. If water is effective at all in putting out ordinary blazes it is because it cools and because it forms a cushion of incombustible steam which smothers the flame by shutting out the oxygen of the atmosphere.

Water and oil do not mix. Hence the hopelessness of putting out a flaming oil tank with water. The oil simply floats and, supplied with oxygen from the air, not only burns on but carries the fire elsewhere. A heavy blanket must be spread over the oil flame. So on American tank farms a blanket of froth is used-a kind of lather.

Two foam solutions are kept on hand to be pumped separately through twin pipes to mixing chambers on the cil tanks or to portable devices. One solution consists of water and aluminlum sulphate and the other of sodium bicarbonate, liquid foaming extract and water. When the two liquids mix there is a rapid effervescence. The bubbles that rise are filled with carbon dioxide gas-one of the most effective fire extinguishers known. The fram oats on liquids and sticks to walls and ceilings. 
