#### A Boon to Fishermen

"Deep sea fishermen must face many razards but for Canadians whose vessels go to the great banks off Newfoundland each year some of the risks are diminished by the action of the Dominion Department of Fisheries in sending a doctor with the fleet so that cases of sickness or accident may have prompt attention by a qualified physician and surgeon," an official statement from Ottawa declares.

Last year this sea-going doctor treated 260 patients on the banks, the Mail. report shows. In 115 of the 260 cases surgical treatment was required, and the other patients were fishermen who had been taken ill with one sickness or another. 
