Manufacturing Operations Mauretania Starts Continue to Expand

The expansion in manufacturing operations throughout Canada is conindustry showing improvement. The heavy industries, which are usually among the last to share in a general upturn, have become more active. The Dominion Steel Corporation has sufficient orders for steel rails on hand now to keep the plants busy for the remainder of the year. The number employed has already been doubled. Textile plants continue to operate at or near capacity with orders that will keep the mills busy for some time. Leather manufacturers and boot and shoe factories likewise are well employed. Newsprint production in June showed a considerable increase over the same month a year ago. Miscellaneous plants report more varied conditions but most of the country's manufacturing industries are operating on a better basis than for many months.
