



Australian Business Conditions Brighter

Adelaide, S. Aust.-After a tour the Eastern States, Mr. Oscar Seppelt former president of the Associated Chambers of Manufacturers, said in an interview that there appeared to be a general industrial revival everymore hopeful terms.

Mr. Seppelt said that firms which hal been losing heavily during the last few years were now looking forward to better times, and they had grounds for their optimism. There were possibilities for many firms balancing their ledgers during the current year. There was a definite indication of the revival of the building trade, and associated industries Australia were showing a distinct in the previous year.
