MID WINTER SESSION OF GREY PRESBYTERY

The mid-winter session of Grey Presbytery of the United Church of Canada, convened in Division Street Church, O. Sound, on Tuesday last, with the chairman Rev. S. Martin, M.A., of Meaford presiding.

Kindly greetings were ordered sent to Rev. W. N. Carr, Rev. G. Kendall, Rev. T. Snowdon, and Rev. J. H. Jarvis, with a special letter of congratulation to the latter, who will attain the advanced age of ninety years in early March.

It was reported that 37 bales of clothing and \$48 in cash were sent to the West from the United Churches of Owen Sound, Durham, Flesherton, Walters Falls, Sydenham, together with two cartloads of apples from the citizens of Thornbury and Clarksburg.

The compilation of the statistics for the year 1933 was not completed but an interim report was presented which showed that present membership is 19,125, that 267 united with the church, that \$46,571 had been raised for local expenses, \$48,834 for ministerial support, \$18,635 for Missionary and Extension Fund, \$19,134 for the Women's Missionary Society, and the grand total for all purposes stands at \$126,501.

An invitation to have the next meeting of Presbytery in Annesley Church, Markdale, was accepted and the date of meeting set for May 1.
