## Seed Grain Distribution \$8 per Month for Necessities of Life

MISS MacPHAIL'S WEEKLY NEWS

Reports, indicating many farmers as having no seed grain and unfortunately little financial credit to buy the same, has reached the government's offices at Toronto. The result of this has been the passing on Mar. 22nd, of 'The Seed Grain Subsidy Act.'

The short week before adjourning for the Easter vacation was taken up principally by discussion of the unemployment and farm relief bill. This important bill occasioned a lengthy debate and called forth some heated argument. Great interest has been aroused by the introduction of an act to improve the methods and practices of marketing natural products in Canada and in export trade.

The Rt. Hon. W. L. Mackenzie King took the position that the bill on unemployment and farm relief should have been introduced much earlier in the session. As it is, the bill must be put through before the last day of March if the money is to be available for relief purposes.

The Warble Fly Campaign proceeds apace. At time of writing the following townships have been organized: Sydenham, Artemesia, St. Vincent, Keppel, Sarawak, Derby, Sullivan, Holland, Collingwood, Normanby, Egremont and Proton.
