400th Anniversary of Jacques Cartier to Canada

Paper Prepared and Read by Mrs J. F. Grant, at April Meeting of Canadian Greys, I. O. D. E.

Canadian History is peculiarly full of interest this year, for 1934 marks the 400th Anniversary of the discovery of Canada, by Jacques Cartier, who sailed from St. Malo, Brittany, April 20, 1534.

The name 'Brittany', Cartier's native land, is connected with the name 'Britain'. The people are of Celtic origin and the Brittany language is allied to the Welsh.

During the years in which the Spanish sailors had been finding so many new lands, the French had only sailed near home.

On Sunday evening last in Knox United Church, Rev. W. H. Smith, B.A., closed an interesting series of sermons, on "The Choice of a Calling," that have been going on each Sabbath evening for the past two months.

On July 24, 1534, at Gaspé, Cartier had the men make a cross 30 feet high with the fleur de lis and the legend 'Vive le Roi de France' inscribed.

He returned next year and the two Indians who could now speak French informed him of a beautiful wide river flowing into the bay from the west.

An Indian village near 'Stadacona', (now city of Quebec), they found very fruitful with many oak, elm and maple trees.

A year passed o'er St. Malo, again came round the day, When the Commodore Jacques Cartier to the westward sailed away.
