CANADIANS.

The disturbance of a year or two ago over the question of Canadian nationality has evidently borne fruit, with the announcement that children born in Canada can now be designted on their birth certificates as "Canadjans." The following significant paragraph is added to the birth certificate: "Nationality is defined as the country to wheih the person owes alegiance. The term 'Canadian' should be used as descriptive of every perwho has rights of citizenship Canada. Every person born in Canada should be entered as 'Canadian' unless he or she has subsequently become the citizen of another country.' With all our vaunting of Canada's proud position as an autonomous nation in the British Commonwealth of Nations, it has required until 1934 A.D. to remedy the anomalous and preposterous condition which denied Canadians the right to call themselves 'Canadian'."-Simcoe Reformer.
