## Quality in Our Cheese Factories

Because Ontario cheese commands a premium for quality on the British market of 2c. per pound, cheese factory patrons in this Province are in pocket by \$1,700,000 on the 85 million pounds of cheese produced Ninety per cent. of this cheese is exported to Great Britain, and the returns to producers here are entirely determined by overseas prices. Reputation for quality, the great-

est asset of the Ontario cheese industry, has been built up by a thorough system of inspection and instruction carried out by the Dairy Branch of the Department of Agriculture. Creameries and cheese factories throughout the Province are divided into groups, thirty in Eastern Ontario, four in Western Ontario and one in the North. Each of these groups is under the personal supervision of a Dairy Branch Inspector, who, by visiting the factories and their patrons, strives to improve the quality of the product. A keen, friendly rivalry has been developed between these groups, and both friendly rivalry has been developed between these groups, and cheese-makers and patrons co-operate to maintain Ontarios reputation. ## Nebraska Farmers Face Ruined Wheat Crops, Bonuses Forbid Corn Crops

Lincoln, Neb. - Nebraska farmers, facing their second consecutive year of heavy drought damage to their crops, are looking to federal bounties paid under the agricultural adjustment programs as the one sure ource of ready cash.

Their pockets bulging with more than \$5,000,000 in wheat benefit payments and nearly \$25,000,000 federal loans on warehoused corn sealed in farm-yard cribs, Nebraska producers were preparing this month for a flood of more than \$40,000,000 in federal money in the form of benefits for adjustment of corn-hog production.

Bountiful as such totals may appear on the surface, however, many farmers are finding that all is not ideal under the federal programs for adjustment of production to levels commensurate with domestic con-
