No. 1, Devonshire Terrace, is one of London's most cherished possessions, for here Charles Dickens spent eleven of the happiest and most prosperous years of his life.

The finding of the "blessed home" as Dickens referred to it, is closely knit with the writing of Barnaby Rudge, which at the time had reached its tenth page and was suffering much from the restlessness of the house-hunting. "Barnaby moves not at race-horse speed," he wrote, "but as fast (I think) as under these unsettled circumstances as could possibly be expected." The "house of great promise (and
