

Holstein Fair up to Usual Standard

Egremont Ag. Society's fall fair at Holstein last Friday met with fine weather though turning chilly late in the afternoon. The crowd was about the usual one, the exhibits good, with quantity varying from past years in different classes.

This year for the first time, Egremont fair was thrown open to the County to exhibitors, though not many outside of the township took advantage of it. There was a good showing of horses, though scarcely as many as last year. Cattle were noticeably fewer; doubtless some former exhibitors held back, fearing strong outside competition. Sheep and swine classes were well filled. John McGirr, Durham and Mr Henry of Walters Falls were two from a distance who won some of the sheep prizes.

In the hall a gratifying display met the eye. The flowers were gorgeous some mammoth dahlias exhibited by Rev. Mr Honeyman and others commanding special notice. Fruit in a poor year was a better display than anticipated, and the baking, vegetables, ladies work, etc. were as good as ever, and just as closely competed for.

The potato race in the football field wound up the fair as usual, and was a close finish. Contestants had to make five trips down and five back, mounting and dismounting at each end to pick up or drop a potato. W. Adams finished first and Ken Ross second.

Mount Forest band provided good music during the day. In evening the hall was crowded to enjoy the play put on by Ayton Dramatic Club, and the dance after was thronged. The Society realized \$150 gross from both on a 25c. fee.
