Auto Revenue 20½ Million

1933 In Ontario - Licence and Gas Tax Twice That Of Quebec

Ottawa,-Revenue derived by Canada's nine provinces from various imposts on automobiles last year showed Ontario collecting \$20,493,342 from registrations and gas tax, with Quebec the next highest province, drawing \$10,0444,671, into the provincial treasury according to figures issued by the Dominion Bureau of Statistics. Ontario's revenue constituted 43 per cent of the total for the Dominion, which was \$47,004,157.

From 1928 unt'l 1932, the last year for which statistics are presently available registrations enriched provincial treasuries by \$123,069,603, or an average for the six years of \$20,511,-600 per anum. In the same period the provinces collected \$130,041,466 in gasoline tax, or an annual average of \$21,673,577.

In all of the provinces the revenue from registration in the past six years has remained fairly constant. Fresh Burdens Placed On Traveling Germans

Berlin,-Further restrictions on Germans wishing to travel abroad have been announced by the Central European Travel Agency which states that it cannot issue through tickets for foreign countries in future except to Switzerland.

In all other cases passengers will have to buy new tickets at frontier stations. The reason given is that the agency mentioned are not able to obtain sufficient foreign currency from the Reichsbank to meet its foreign settlements.

Putting Bees Away For Winter

Bees that are to be wintered in cellar or dug-out should be carried immediately after the last good cleansing flight they are likely to get. At the Central Experimental Farm this is usally during the first week in November.

France Gives Up Hope Of Balancing Budget

Paris, - An unbalanced 1935 budget for France was accepted as inevitable by Finance Minister Louis Germain-Martin after a vain effort to make receipts and expenditures meet. The deficit is estimated at more than 500,000,000 francs (about \$\$33,-

The finance minister said he would not try to balance the budget by either further economics or new taxes. He said that while business is bad, the crisis appears to be at its worst, and conditions will improve unless something worse happens in the international atmosphere.
