Melt the maple sugar in a double boiler, then add the syrup, the butter, the corn starch dissolved in 2 tablespoons of cold milk, the rest of the mixture forms a soft ball when dropped into cold water, or to 238 degrees on the candy thermometer. Stir in the nuts and vanilla and pour into oiled pans. Cut into squares when cold and roll in paraffin paper.
