Be Increased Firmness in Hog Prices Will Lead to Popularity For

Lambs As a result of drought conditions

In Canada the situation is likely to follow along somewhat similar lines. Already as a result of the rapid rise in the price of beef across Canada and the firm condition of the hog market due to heavy exports of bacon to Great Britain and lower hog deliveries as compared with a year ago, the position in regard to the consumption of lamb is

becoming increasingly favorable. Lamb in both Canada and the United States is, at the moment, a bargain counter meat. In the United States sheep flocks have with stoo. drought conditions much better

See Big Expense In Cleaning Canal

St. Catharines. - Following a recent inspection of the old Welland Canal. from Thorold to Port Dalhousie, by Government and municipal officials and representatives of the industries concerned, fear was expressed that in order to deal satisfactorily with the sewage problem presented by the present condition

Officials who went over the course included Dr. W. J. Bell, deputy minister of health, G. M. Galumbert, rep-"Most of the recent great wars resenting the province, and E. P. ed to have found immense stretches of the canal filled with wood fibre from paper mills. In other spots, sounding rods penetrated 11 feet of muck before striking bottom.

The inspection marked another step in the efforts of Provincial, Federal and municipal authorities to find some adequate solution to the health and nuisance problem arising out of the polluted canal. Several conferences have been held at Queen's Park and at St. Catharines, and engineering studies are now in the course of completion. Estimates of the cost of the projected disposal scheme are reported to run well into the millions.
