FISH FROZEN IN ACID

Freezing fish in a film of boric acid solution is proving a boom to Canadian shippers of finny foodstuffs. When frozen fish are shipped in an unprotected state, they lose moisture rapidly and the flavor of the fish is impaired. For some time has been the practice to seal the fish up in a film of ice in order to keep the natural moisture in the flesh. Graded on Rail

System In Selling Hogs Meets With Approval

The experiment of selling all hogs on their dressed percentage and grade on the rail which was started a few weeks ago in Prince Edward Island is now to become official J. A. Gillis, secretary of the live stock marketing board of Prince Edward Island reports that good results have been obtained by rail grading of hogs and marketing on a dressed weight basis. The method is optional but it is anticipated that it will be universally adopted by farmers producing fair to top quality hogs.
