GOVERNMENT CLINIC AT DURHAM HOSPITAL

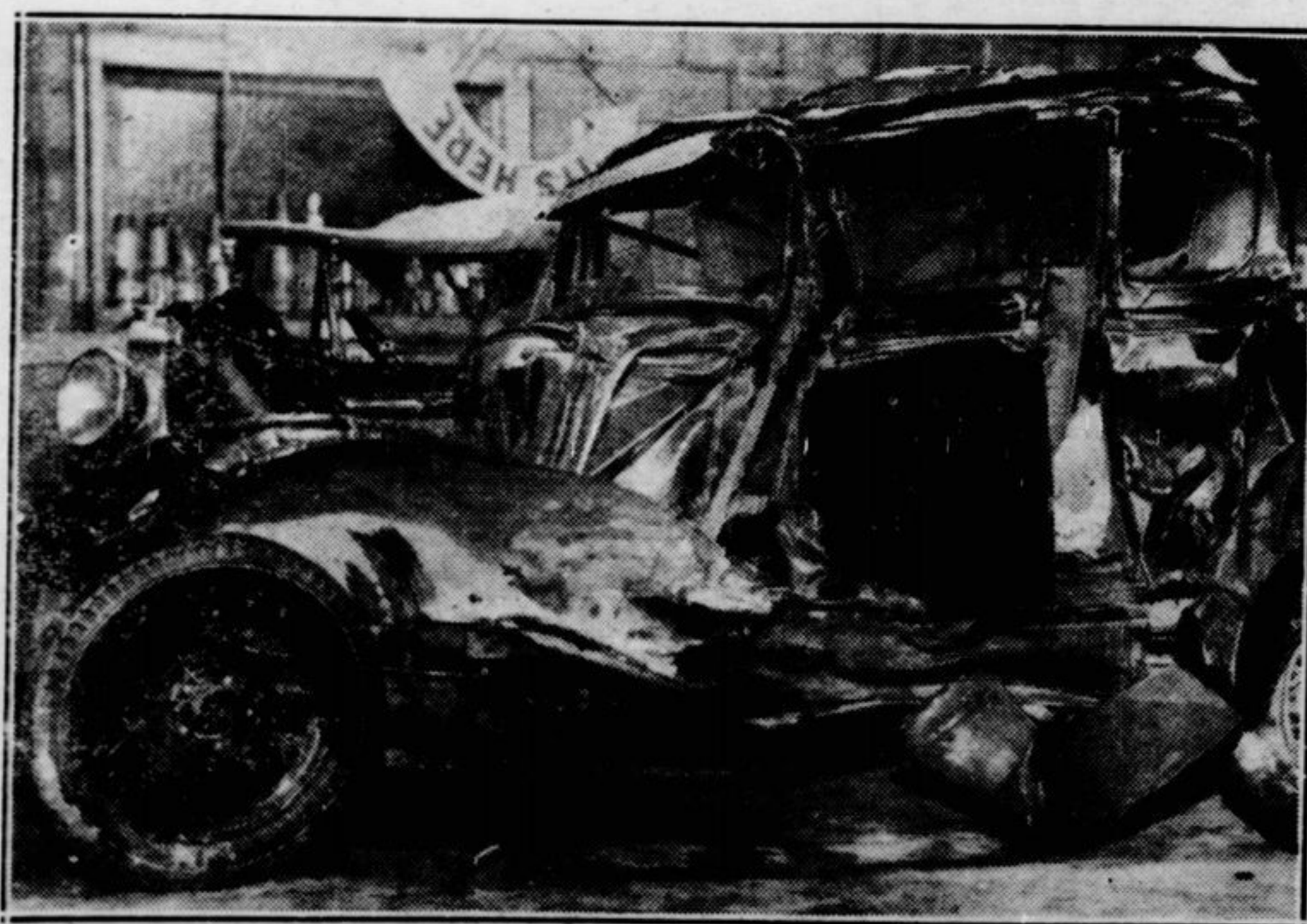
