But Silver Trade Less Than Half of Month Last Year

Canada's export of gold bullion during August was worth more than double the value of the same month last year, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reports.

At the same time silver bullion exported dropped to less than half the value of August, 1935.

Exports of gold bullion was worth \$10,424,300, all of which went to the United States, and compared with \$4,045,989 in August last year, while exports of silver bullior were valued at \$696,769 against \$1,791. a kiss. 940 last year
