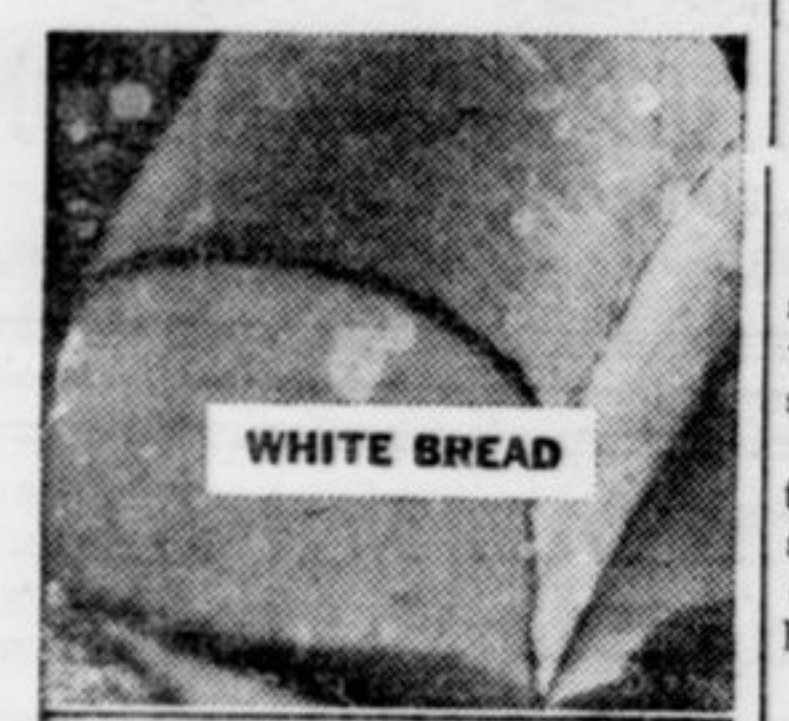

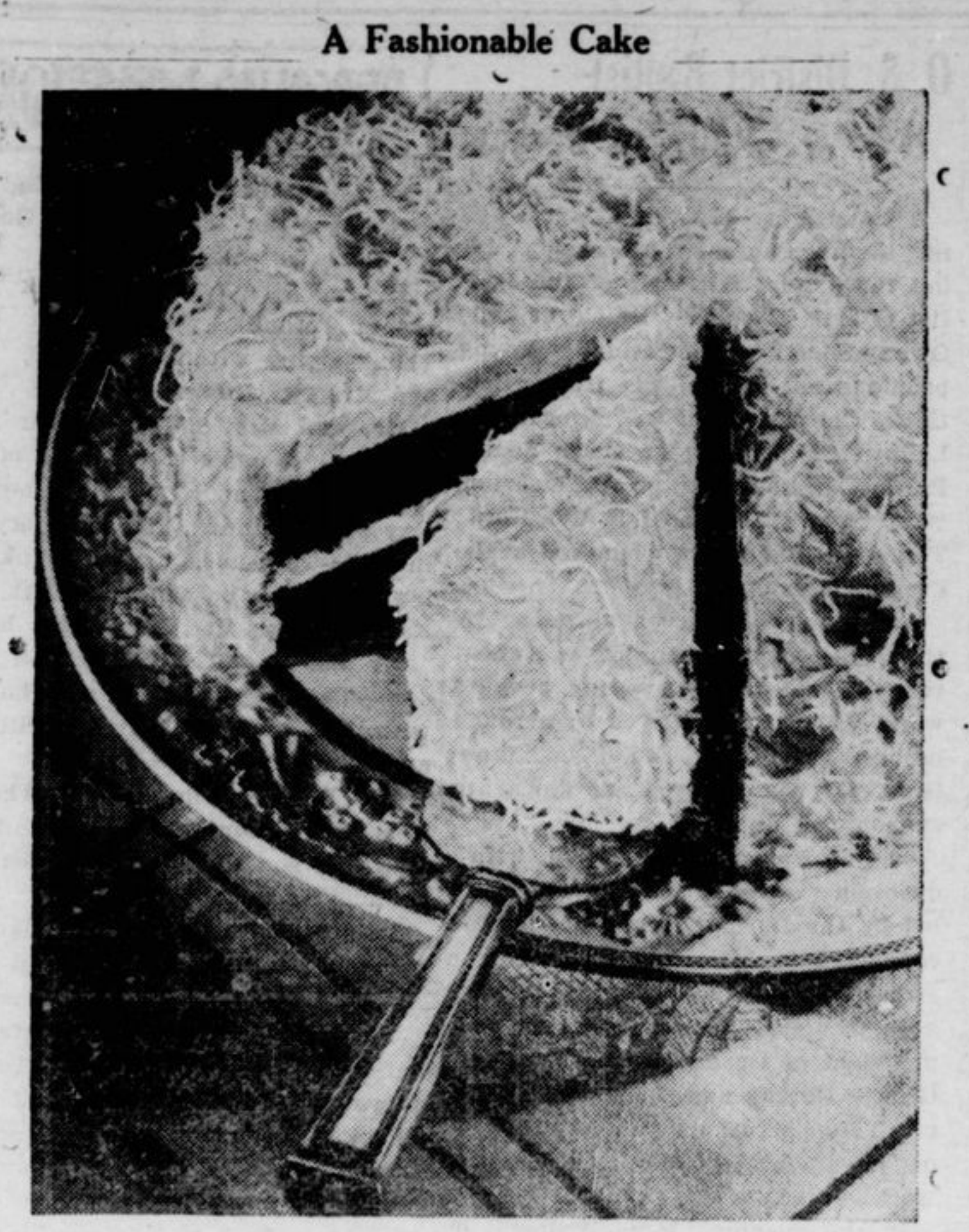

Autumn luncheons may go in for smart color schemes. The table decorations may be chrysanthemums in russet shades or rich autumn leaves in rich colorings of red, gold, and brown.

A coconut Devil's Food Cake—dark brown and fluffy white is picturesque with any table color scheme, but certainly adds the right note to an autumn or early winter menu. It is a combination of smooth richness and light flavorsome shreds of coconut. You will become ravenous for cakes with your guests if you serve this at any party.

The rest of the luncheon may be very simple because a dessert such as coconut Devil's Food Cake that combines so many nourishing ingredients is so delicious, it will make a real impression.

Coconut Devil's Food Cake
2 cups sifted cake flour, 1 teaspoon soda, 1/2 cup butter or other shortening, 1 1/4 cups firmly packed brown sugar, 1 cup milk, 2 eggs or 3 egg yolks, unbeatens, 3 squares unsweetened chocolate, melted, 1 teaspoon vanilla.

Sift flour once, measure, add soda and sift together three times. Cream butter thoroughly, add sugar gradually, and cream together until light and fluffy. Add eggs, one at a time, beating well after each; then add chocolate and blend. Add flour, alternately with milk, a small amount at a time, beating after each addition until smooth. Add vanilla. Bake in two deep greased 9-inch layer pans or three greased 8-inch layer pans in moderate oven (350 deg. F.) 25 minutes. Spread Coconut Sea Foam Frosting between layers and on top and sides of cake. Double recipe for three 10-inch layers for large party cake.

Coconut Sea Foam
2 egg whites, unbeatens, 1 cup firmly packed brown sugar, dash of salt, 5 tablespoons water, 1 teaspoon vanilla, 1 can coconut, southern style.

Combine egg whites, sugar and salt, and water in top of double boiler, beating with rotary egg beater until thoroughly mixed. Place over rapidly boiling water, beat constantly with rotary egg beater and cook 7 minutes, or until frosting will stand in peaks. Remove from boiling water; add vanilla and beat until

Make this in the proportion of one cup of salt and two quarts of boiling water. After several days pour off the brine, bring to boil and pour it back on the cucumbers.

At the end of the week remove the cucumbers, pack in glass jars and cover with a pickling liquid made by boiling a gallon of pure cider vinegar with a cup of dark brown sugar and an ounce each of celery, black mustard and white mustard seeds. A small red pepper or two in each jar adds to the flavor and to the appearance. The rule just given is good also for plain mixed pickles.

OTTAWA—A gain of 22.6 per cent. in volume and 20.1 per cent. in amount was shown in financing of motor vehicles during August compared with the corresponding month last year, the Dominion Bureau of Statistics reported recently.

Total vehicles financed in August totaled 11,136 and the amount of financing was \$4,293,329 against 9,081 at \$3,404,783 in August, 1935.



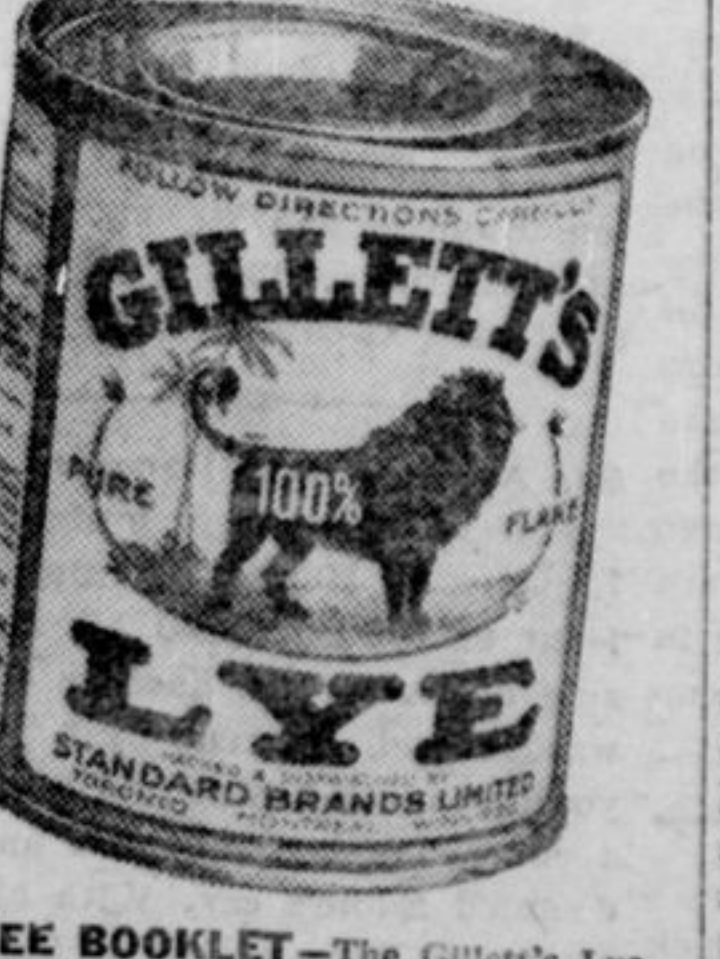

At first thought there may not seem much chance to improve or vary the structure of gloves. But the new collections exhibit new and interesting features. As usual, the improvements are mainly dictated by sport. Gloves are important for riding. And some take the form of chamol slip-on with string finger grips, reinforcements coming exactly where required. Leather gloves and string gloves have always been with us, but now the two fabrics are intermixed.

Surely the most interesting design is that infused for going. This chamol glove possesses large ventilation holes and slit and button—all at the back! The palm may be strengthened by kid. For ordinary wear peccary and other hogskin remain popular. They make the twin appeal of smartness and toughness. Lemon and gray shades have been in demand, but browns, tans and similar tones will be in evidence through the coming months.
