## Lean Years Over In Show Business

Tent Shows Will Return To Quarters After Big Year

NEW YORK — A bull market in clowns and fan dancers! Broadway casting offices jammed with torch singers, hoofers and heavies! Hollywood hard at work on a "recovery" production schedule! And 80,000,000 persons a week swarming to the movies!

That, they tell you on the Rialto, indicates that lean days for the show business are about over; that economic recovery—extending from dividend cheques to the price of cotton—has put people back where they can pay good hard cash for entertainment.

Broadway is drawing its people homeward in hordes, for early fall is casting time in showland and trouperes are packing the managerial offices in quest of parts.

Motion pictures, swinging into new production, and into the fall and winter nights, are coming on the best season since 1930.

The tent shows will return to winter quarters only after another month or two of what has been the best business for years.

## Veterans Are Thrifty

Writes the Baltimore Sun:—Distribution of almost \$1,700,000,000 in bonus bonds among the war veterans has produced none of the more extreme results predicted by proponents as well as opponents of the bonus. There has been no foolish spending spree on the part of the veterans. New York has there been an extraordinary boom in trade. About \$600,000,000 has been temporarily added to the currency in circulation, according to the estimates of the Federal Reserve Board, but that can hardly be called wildly inflationary.

As a matter of fact, the former soldiers have shown themselves a good deal thrifter than it had been supposed that they would. Although most of the bonds were issued three months ago, about thirty-one per cent of them have not been turned in for cash. This would suggest that the veterans are holding about \$500,000,000 worth of bonds for investments. In addition, it is believed that at least a part of the \$600,000,000 that has been added to the currency in circulation is still being held by the veterans. It may well be, then, that not half of the bonus money has been spent.

## FINANCIAL FLASHES

Athona Mines, Ltd., through J. J. Byrne, president, who is on a visit to the property in the Lake Athabasca area, reports that a quartzite mass has been exposed on the east shore of the lake for a width of 120 feet, and shows high-grade veinlets at intervals across the full width. A rock trench, nearing completion, has exposed three zones from 16 to 15 feet wide, and each zone shows several quartz stringers carrying abundant galena, sphalerite and some gold pyrite confined principally to the quartzite. Grab samples from each zone, which showed no visible gold, assayed, \$245, \$2450 and \$33.95. Work on the No. 1 shaft gave assay returns of \$54.25 from channel samples taken across 57 inches. The No. 3 zone has been extended another 3 feet, bringing the width to 18 inches.

Underground development is continuing at the Sturgeon River property of Brengold Mines, Ltd., with drifting being advanced both east and west on No. 2 vein. Five face samples taken over a length of 25 feet on the No. 2 vein at the 100-foot level, gave an average width of 31 inches and average value of \$21.07 per ton, it is officially stated.

Production of Siscoe Gold Mines for September amounted to \$210,316, a new high record for the mine, and compares with \$208,207 in the preceding month and \$190,413 in September of last year. During the month the mill handled 16,578 tons of ore with millheads of \$13 per ton, against 15,355 tons handled and heads of \$13.55 in August.

Cumtatu Mines produced 100,000 pounds of matte, containing approximately 30,000 pounds of nickel and 50,000 pounds of copper, during the period of Sept. 16 to Oct. 1, officials report. Assay reports on the precious metal have not as yet been received, but, judging from the shipment made early in September, this 100,000 pounds should contain approximately 20-25 ozs. gold, 140-150 ozs. platinum and 450-500 ozs. silver. The market value of the contained metals would exceed \$22,000, on the basis of market price for refined metals.

Spookman Gold Mines officials have been notified that the shares have been approved for registration by the Securities & Exchange Commission at Washington, D.C. Surface work on the property adjoining Red Lake Gold Shore has exposed nine veins which have been opened up for varying distances. A complete diamond drilling outfit is on the property and has been set, with drilling already underway. The first hole has reached a depth of 40. A second drill is now enroute to the property, while a complete assay plant has arrived and is being set up. Further channel sampling of No. 1 vein returned values ranging from \$9.45 to \$105 per ton. Recently a value of 3.2 ozs. was secured across a width of 24 inches in an 8-foot test pit located where veins No. 2 and 4 intersect. A crew of 17 men are employed on the property.

## Vegetable Crops Winter Storage

A Thermometer Is a Good Friend in Storage Room

Don't let the frost injure the crops before you take them into the cellar. Don't bring them in while they are wet.

Don't cover roots with damp sand if the cellar is hot. They will start to grow if you do.

Don't try to store onions, squash or pumpkin in a cool cellar. They will keep better in a drier, somewhat warmer room.

Don't forget to watch your storage room and sort out any decayed specimens before the trouble spreads.

Don't forget that a thermometer is a good friend in a storage room. If it is possible to provide a special storage place, select that part of the cellar farthest removed from the furnace and where the greatest amount of air circulation takes place.

## Canada Better Place For Immigrant Boys

CALGARY — Immigrant boys are better situated in under-populated Canada, Mr. G. F. Morton, leading British educationist, has found in a survey of conditions in this country. The headmaster of Leeds Modern, one of the early English Victorian institutions near the city of Leeds, advocates immigration to relieve the pressure of over-population in Europe.

Dr. Morton has completed a tour of Canada where he met, in various cities and on farms, old boys from his school's alumni who left England between the years 1924 and 1929 for the colonies. He will visit Australia before returning home. "I have always urged those who are adventurous to emigrate from the Old Land. Now I am seeking to determine how they are making out—comparing their standard of living with that in England. "I find nearly all the boys are better off in Canada than they would be at home and I will continue to urge the present pupils of the school to try their lives in the Dominion," he said.

## Cruelty To Children At Guelph O.A.C.

GUELPH, Ont. — Freshmen at the Ontario Agricultural College here are forbidden to speak to members of the opposite sex under pain of dire penalties, as part of their initiation rites this term. They are not allowed to smoke and must carry their schoolbooks in a fruit basket. They also "fag" for their superiors.

## Schools to Teach Highway Safety

RALEIGH, N.C.—Highway safety will be taught in the public schools of North Carolina, the teaching material to be furnished by Arthur Fulk, director of the highway safety division of the State Department of Revenue. Special booklets have been prepared.

"We are planning to confer with State Superintendent Clyde A. Erwin with a view to securing the co-operation of the Department of Public Instruction," Mr. Fulk said.

"We will suggest that this department use its influence to get the teachers to give definite instructions in safe walking and safe driving in at least one elementary grade and one high grade, although we believe that some safety instruction should be given in every elementary grade, beginning with the first. Emphasis should be placed on safety in walking, roller skating and bicycling up to the sixth grade and in the seventh additional information should be imparted to the students, emphasizing the importance of safe driving."

## Canada Half Way Back To Recovery
