

A Benefit Which More and More Farmers Are Recognizing

Aid to Pastures

The value of the application of fertilizers in the fall to pastures and alfalfa, and particularly to permanent pastures is becoming more generally recognized. The fertilizers used for this purpose, being composed of phosphates and potashes, do not leech from winter snows and rains, and the plant food they supply is ready to give the desired results with the first growth in the spring. Further, the fall application is a saving of time in the spring when so many other farm operations demand attention. The application may be made either before or

after the freeze-up. The specially belanced fertilizers for this purpose recommended by the Provincial Fertilizer Boards are 0-12-6, 0-12-10, 0-12-15, 0-16-6. 0-16-10 and 0-16-12, to be applied at the rate of at least 300 pounds per acre. It would be wasteful to apply a complete fertilizer in the fall, that is, one containing nit-

rogen in addition to the phosphoric acid and potash, as most of the nitrogen would be lost by leeching or ammoniation before plant growth had started in the spring.

Great Britain Gets Canadian Eggs

Exports of Canadian eggs to Great Britain in the export season which started recently are expected to aggregate in the neighbourhood of one and one-quarter million dozen eggs. The export season extends from the middle of September to the latter part of November and at the end of September about 9,000 cases-3,240-000 eggs-had gone forward. The export trade at this season

made up of eggs laid in the spring which are held under refrigeration until shipping date. Saskatchewan, Manitoba and Ontario are the chief exporting provinces, with Quebec and Alberta making smaller shipments.

#### World's Oldest **Human Portrait** Carved in Ivory

Tiny Head of Stone Age Woman Discovered at Vestonice, Czechoslovakia, 30,000 Years Old

Discovery of the oldest haman portrait in the world- older by at least 15,000 years than any in existence-has been announced by Dr. Carl Absalon, who has been a pioncer in digging up remains of the prehistoric mammoth hunters of Central Lurope.

The portrait is a tiny head of a Stone Age woman, roughly carved in ivory. It was found at Vestonica. Czechoslovakia amid the bones of extinct mammoths and other relics. Ice Age Artists

Sir Arthur Keith, writing in the current issue of the Illustrated London News, regards it as "definite and irrefutable proof that there was a Leonardo da Vinci amongst the mammoth hunters of Moravia, a people who lived when Europe was still in the grip of the Ice Age.

There is a trace of the screne Mona Lisa expression in th's little lump of prehistoric sculpture which scientists acc'aimed as one of the most astonishing finds of archaeology in many years. Photographs of it show a noble and sensitive face with arched ridges over the eyebrows, a long, slightly upturned nose and a long chin.

But in prehistoric Moravia, according to Dr. Absalon, "some heretic, some sacrilegious man deserted the religion of his fathers, and in defiance of all tradition carved the portrait of a true face." but exults over it all the same. "How often." he writes, "have anthropologists longed to have a realistic portrait of the extinct men they sought to reconstruct from the bare bones of skulls! And now they have one. It is not merely the early history of Moravia that Dr. Absalon is opening up, but also the history of our European forefathers and foremothers soon after their arrival in Central Europe."

Missionery Ship Returns to Que-

bee with Museum Specimens The little miss onary ship, Marie Francoise Therese, slipped into Quebec harbor last week in the same quiet, unannounced way she sailed last July on a 7,000-mile voyage that was to carry her to remote mission

of the duty. It was the skin of a huge white polar bear that aroused the enthusiasm of Father DuTilly. He killed the 800-rounder with a single shot from a gun given him by a man in Quebec before the expedition left Quebec last July 19th.

Eskimo Utensils Also in his little cab'n, which he was tidying in preparation for a visit from Cardinal Villeneuve, were some 200 varieties of old bone spearheads, knives, fishing equipment and Eskis mo cooking utensils which Father DuTilly will take to Ottawa and Washington where he will complete his "documentary study" of his

Veteran of the Arctic, Father Duplain served as pilot on the ship. commanded by Capt. Joseph Levesque, of Quebec, and manned by nine French-Canadian seamen. The wireless was handled by Father DuTilly, who kept in touch with the m'ssion headquarters at Churchill while the ship made her way up the coast of Labrador to Hudson Bay. The "Therese" first called at Chesterfield Inlet and attended a congress of Catholic missionaries of the district. Later, she plowed to lonely posts at Baker Lake, Repulse Bay and Iglulik.
