Newton Rowell declared at Winnipeg before the initial session of the Royal Commission on Dominion-Provincial Rela-

1. To re-examine the economic and financial basis of Confederation and the distribution of legislative powers in the light of economic and social developments of the last seventy

2. To investigate the character and amount of taxes collected from the people of Canada and to determine whether taxation as at present allocated and imposed is as equitable and as efficient as can be devised.

3. To examine public expenditures and public debts in general in order | kin... to determine the ability of the Dominion and Provincial governments to discharge their constitutional responsibilities within the frame work of the present allocation of powers or on the basia of some form of reallocation

Seek Balance of Relationship 4. To investigate the whole question of Dominion subsidies and grants to provincial governments. This necessarily involves the question of whether a system of subsidies and grants to provincial governments is the best method of enabling provincial governments to discharge their responsibilities or whether there are

more effective alternatives. 5. Following these inquiries the commission is instructed 'to consider and report upon the facts disclosed by their investigations and to express what, in their opinion, subject to the retention of the distribution of legislative powers essential to a proper carrying out of the federal system in harmony with national needs and the promotion of national unity, will best effect a balance of relationship between the financial powers and the obligations and functions of each governing body and conduce to a more efficient, independent and economical discharge of governmental responsibilities in Canada."

Hare Cycles Said Ten Years Apart

Northern Snowshoe Rabbits Are Found to "Die Off" Every Decade

The popular belief that the snowshoe rabbits of Canada's north woods die off every seven years is challenged in a report on a four-year study of hare periodicity, just published. The cycles are nearer 10 years in length on the average, it is stated.

The study was made by Dr. D. A. MacLulich under the joint auspices of the department of biology, University of Toronto, and the Royal Ontario Museum of Zoology.

Paralycia County

ports Findings After

Tests TORONTO. - The zinc sulphate nasal spray treatment for immunization against infantile paralysis is ineffective, H. J. Kirby, Ontario Minister of Health, announced here following the first mass experimentation with the

treatment ever undertaken. The province ordered experimental treatment of 7,000 children this summer in the midst of the infantile paralysis epidemic, after announcement of the discovery by Chicago doctors. The treatments showed that several cases of the disease were contracted after administrations of the second treatment, Kirby announced.

Not Fast Enough "The treatment is ineffective as it cannot properly be done sufficiently quickly to meet the emergency of an outbreak and it cannot be considered practical as a public health procedure," the Minister of Health said. The solution used was one per cent zinc sulphate, one per cent pontocaine and .5 per cent, sodium chloride, administered at the rate of one-half cubic centimeter in the first and second sprays.
