

Tiny Radio Waves Travel In Pipe

One Pipe Might Carry All 'Phone Conversations Between Cities

Lilliputian wireless waves so short they travel inside a pipe and are picked up on an antenna only one inch high were placed before the radio engineering world at New York last week by the Bell Telephone laborator-

In pipes, the engineers were informed, these midget waves promise to travel like telegraphd messages, but without the limits imposed by a wire. A single small pipe, between two cities, for example, might carry all the telephone conversations want-

Four to Eight Inches Long

The waves exhibited ranged from four to eight inches long. They travelled through a 20-foot exhibition pipe. Like all short radio waves these midgets reflect light. Metal discs, used as mirrors, reflect the waves into one end of the pipe. The inch-long antenna picks them off at the other end. They have been piped a mile.

The waves are made by tubes no larger than a common electric light bulb. Their "frequencies" or pulsations, are thousands of millions of times a second.

Close to Heat Waves

Still shorter wireless waves, only an inch and a quarter, have been produced in the Bell laboratories. These vibrate at ten thousand million times a second. They are very close to heat waves. At California Institute of Technology at Pasadena research workers experimenting with similar short waves, report unusual experiments in imparting artificial fevers to selected tissues. Thus one type of short wave might heat a bone, and another flesh, a third blood.

London Traffic Found Lighter

Arterial Highways Are Being Used

LONDON, Eng.-Scotland Yard ha sprung a surprise on London's traffic experts, says the Christian Science

In the latest traffic census issued by the police headquarters it is revealed that central London's traffic has decreased instead of increasing as anticipated.

For instance it had been confidently predicted that traffic at Hyde Park Corner, busiest point in the metropolis, would have risen from the 1935 figure of 82,728 vehicles in 12 hours to about 100,000 in 1937. Instead there was a decrease of 2,000 vehicles on the day the census was taken.



Ontario's Soil Being Robbed Of Its Minerals

York Council, Alarmed by Destructive Flow, Would Replenish Valuable Elements In the

When you drink your glass of milk in the morning you are drinking up the soil values of Ontario. And it's got the farmers of York County wor-

In fact, so many minerals are being transferred from soil on farms in the County of York to the stomachs of Toronto citizens that the Committee on Agriculture, Reforestation and Markets of York County Council has decided to do something about it.

Goes Into Milk "We note the large quantities of milk shipped daily from the farms in the county, containing calcium and other minerals which, in our opinion, is a drain on the mineral content of the soil. Therefore, we would ask the Chemistry Department at Guelph to conduct a soil survey in the County, thereby enabling farmers to return to the soil the proper minerals through

fertilizers," the committee said. It is a case of the minerals of the soil going into the cow, via its food, and to the citizens of Toronto via the cow's milk, explained Dr. G. I. Christie, Director of Ontario Agricultural College. And it has a lot of farmers in many other places in Ontario wor-

Phosphorus, Potassium Missing "Multiply the minerals in one cow's milk by the amount of milk used in Toronto and you'd find it came to several thousand pounds," explained Dr. Christie. "These minerals are taken from the soil, and if they are no put back the soil naturally is depleted."

The Government already is surveying Oxford, Brant, Northumberland and Durham for this very thing, Dr. Christie said, and strong resoluti) s urging surveys have been passed by the County Councils of Peterb wough and Grey.

Usually phosphorus and potassium have been found to be chief among the missing after many years of grazing, he said.

Changes Planned In Farmers' Act Dunning Tells House Amend-

ments Will Be Brought In Shortly Amendments to the Farmer's Creditors Arrangement Act will be brought into the House of Commons shortly by a Government measure, Finance Minister Dunning told the House last week. He suggested private members

Douglas (C.C.F.-Weyburn) asking for amendments to the Act to extend its provisions to the legal representatives of deceased farmers and to insolvent

owners of leased farms. Another amendment in Mr. Douglas' bill would provide for hearing an amendment of proposals formulated

prior to December, 1936. The Farmers' Creditors Arrangement Act was passed in 1934 and provides machinery whereby debtor farmers may reach compromises with their creditors without going though

bankruptcy. Dairy Production Continues Upward

Keeps On Increasing In Canada During Past Nine Years Production of milk in Canada has been moving steadily upward for the past nine years, and in 1937, the output of nearly 17 billion pounds was an increase of about 200 million pounds over that of 1936, Milk is used in a variety of ways with only about 40 per cent being used in the fluid form, Buttermaking takes the greatest amount of milk and close to 50 per cent of the total output is skimmed and churned into butter. It takes about 8 per cent of the milk produced to make cheese and approximately 1.2 per cent of the milk is processed into concentrated milk products. The percentage going into ice cream manufacturers is relatively small. There was a significant gain in the value of all dairy products in 1937 when, due to increased production and
