In selecting a list of annual flow to time of blooming and colour, Height should also be noted as a medium sized plant may be hidden by some bushy stocks or tall cosmos. But these are only elemental points which every gardener of a few years' experience notes automatically. There are other and finer distinctions. 



"Democracy Must **Bring Prosperity** Or Succumb

Says Former Canadian Minister to Washington-"If It Fails, It Dies"-Canadians Must Use Their Power To Make Democracy Win.

Democracy's new job in Canada is to achieve prosperity for its citizens and "if it fails, it dies," W. D. Herridge, former Canadian minister to Washington, said in a radio talk from Ottawa last week.

Prosperity is natural to the new social order and "democracy must get that prosperity for us," he said.

One Chance Left Mr. Herridge declared the test of democracy lies in its ability to provide prosperity. "It is the best test," he said "because prosperity is much more than an economic achievement. It is the only foundation for freedom. It is the proof of the rule of justice. It is the clear road for the march of Christian faith.

"Up to this time, democracy has failed in Canada. It has this once and only chance left; which continues for a short time only."

Rests With Citizens

Mr. Herridge said the decision to take this remaining chance rests with the citizens who make up democracy. "For if Canada is defeated, it will not be Fascism which defeats it, or the old order or reaction. It will be the average citizen, his inertia, his laissez-faire, his refusal to support reform, his lack of courage to go out and
