Contracts awarded for all types of construction throughout Canada for the month of August, as compiled by MacLean Building Reports Limfred, amounted to \$22.113.400 as compared with \$21,158,200 for July, This is the highest monthly total for the year to date and is the seventh consecutive month to register an increase over the preceding month.

Awards for eight months to date total \$123,926,800, the highest since 1931 with the exception of 1937. when the total for the first eight months was \$159,691,900.

Ontario In The Lead

Ontario provided the largest portion of the month's total with \$9,-\$27,300; Quebec, \$6,749,900; British Columbia, \$1,561,960; Nova Scotia, \$1.067,000; Manitoba, \$923,400; New Brunswick, \$881,600; Alberta, \$534,-000; Saskatchewan, \$415,700; P. E. Island, \$52,600.

Contracts awarded for projects on the Island of Montreal amounted to \$2,464,200 as compared with \$1,-\$27,400 for the Toronto metropolitan area. Total for year to date, Montreal, \$12,002,700; Toronto, \$14,-784,900.

Contemplated new construction for August amounted to \$24,617,600 as compared with \$24,572,100 for July. Total for year to date, \$207,-

Alfalfa Seed Crop Prospect

Second Yield Is Expected To Be Better In Ontario This Year -Increase in Prairies

It is yet too early to estimate the total yield of the alfalfa seed erop in Canada for this year, states the Plant Products Division, Dominion Department of Agriculture. A great deal will depend on the setting of seed of the second crop of alfalfa in Ontario where most of the seed is grown in Canada. The first crop in Ontario failed to set seed, but it is hoped that the second crop will turn out better. The second crop has bloomed well under variable weather conditions for seed set-

The alfalfa seed crop in the Prairie Provinces has increased remarkably in the last few years. The estimated crop this year is 21/2 million pounds as compared with 1% million pounds in 1937. This is due to an increased acreage. It is mostly of the Grimm, Cossak and Ladak strains. The western crop will, therefore, furnish a fine supply of seed for the rest of Canada even if the Ontario erop is light, which is likely from present appearances.

Finnish Attitude Towards Women

Finland Was First European Country To Give Them The Franchise-Fair Sex Given Equal Chance With Men In

Everyone knows, or should know, that Finland was the first country in Europe to grant the suffrage to its women, writes A. M. P. in the Glasgow Herald. One hour in Helsingfors is enough to show the visitor that that Act was no piece of party legislation rushed through in a national crisis, but the natural outcome of definite attitude towards women.

A Wellsian peep into the future of farming was afforded visitors to the Royal Agricultural Show at Cardiff, Wales, in a display of electrical machinery which some day may turn farming into an arm-chair industry.

Laboratory wizards have perfected electrical gadgets which do almost everything but eliminate the hen in egg laying and poultry raising. And in a low-roofed shed the same magical force grows enough food for ten milk cowswhich increases their yield continuously.

WORLD'S RAREST GAS

A new still that manufactures three quarts a day of the rarest gas in the world, heavy nitrogen, was announced last week by Columbia University.

The difference between ordinary nitrogen and heavy nitrogen, though small, is of great importance to chemists. The first use is to attach these rare molecules to food. There they replace ordinary nitrogen. They permeate the living tissues the same as the common nitrogen and because of their greater weight, their course through the body can be traced.

Biologists are using this method to find out where nutrients go after digestion, and how long they stay in the body.

VITAMIN "K" ISOLATED

Complete isolation of vitamin "K"-diet factor necessary for coagulation of blood - was announced this week by Dr. Edward A. Doisy, St. Louis University research chemist. Dr. Doisy said the transparent and colorless crystals of pure vitamin were obtained from an alfalfa meal oil.

Slow Lightning

When a flash of lightning is not followed by a thunderclap, you may be certain that it is what is known technically as a "slow" flash. That is, it has not discharged energy at the usual rate.

Thunder is caused by the release of energy in millionths of a second, but according to K. B. McEachron, expert of the General Electric Company, when a flash is not followed by thurder, the release takes from one to two-tenths of a second, and such discharges are far less destructive than those accompanied by thunder.

Thunder, incidentally, is the result of a wave of pressure caused by a rapid expansion of air resulting from a quick discharge of energy.

A. I would say that our experience does not favour broadcasting fertilizer for grain, or root crops. Greatest benefit is obtained from fertilizer for these crops when the material is concentrated to a large extent near the young growing seed. When the same fertilizer is sown broadcast, it is so dispersed through the growing area that the young plant is unable to obtain a maximum benefit from it. I would certainly advise you to obtain drill from fertilizer dropping attachment for the sowing of fertilizer on your grain crops, if this is at all possible. Of course, on meadow
