Growing pains, according to a British investigator, are usually found in children who are ill, weak, undernourished, unhappy, work too hard, or walk too far to school. The children who have these pains usually suffer frequently from colds and occasionally also have bad posture.

Ten Rules For Stocking Care

If Followed, They Will Save You Money, Keep Looking

Read through these ten rules for stockings. You win top marke if you keep them all: you deserve a warning if you don't.

1. Always buy at least two pairs in the same shade.

2. Do not fasten your suspenders to the unprotected silk of your stockings.

3. Always wear rubber gloves when washing your stockings otherwise you deserve the runs and ladders that you get.

4. Never put stockings in hot water. The water, which should be frothy with good quality suds, and, if you like, a dash of ammonia, must be only lukewarm.

5. Never wear a new pair of stockings before washing. 6. Do not pull your stockings on. Always roll them carefully, 7. Never iron stockings.

8. Always mend ladders with fine crochet hook, bringing the dropped stitch up through the rungs of the ladder until you reach the top.

9. Either carry a patent ladder stopper, or piece of soap, so that you can dab on to each end of a new ladder to stop it spreading. 10. Wash your steekings after

each wearing. Dry them in a warm room, away from direct heat.

CANADIAN FISH SOUFFLE PUFFS UP WITH PRIDE And So Does the Clever Hostess Who Serves It

Many women are afraid to make a souffle because they have "heard" it is difficult. When you come right down to it there's nothing mysterious or difficult about it, but because it seems difficult to so many women, the woman who tries it and finds how easy it is soon achieves a reputation, and her friends' opinion of her goes

up several notches. Here's a recipe you will find practically foolproof and easy to make, and oh! how delicious it is to eat! Besides, from a budget point of view, a souffle is a grand addition to any menu, because it is inexpensive to make, and may be served as a one-dish meal, or the main dish for supper or luncheon. Begin with a clear soup, or serve canned oyster soup or fish chowder in small portions. This is to guarantee that everyone is sitting ready and waiting when your souffle comes out of the oven. Serve it while it's hot, in the first flush of its puffy goodness, and you'll get lots of requests "to make it again", which is certainly music to any homemaker's ears.

CANADIAN FISH SOUFFLE

3 tablespoons butter 11/2 cups cooked or canned fish (sardine, salmon, cod, halibut) Salt and pepper

4 tablespoons flour 1 cup milk

1/2 teaspoon dry mustard Melt butter, add flour, mix well, cook a few minutes, stirring constantly. Add hot milk, a little at a time, season and stir until thick. Cool. Add beaten egg yolks and fish. (You may now set it aside until 30 minutes before serving time.) Fold in the beaten egg white and pour in a greased casserole. Cook 30 to 40 minutes in a moderate oven (350 degrees F.) While not necessary, setting the baking dish in a pan of water makes the souffle even more delicate, but allow a little more time. Grated cheese may be sprinkled

over the top, if desired. Garnish with parsley, serve with string beans or peas, and parsley potatoes, and follow with a fruit gelatine dessert.

NOT stretch the skin. Here are hints for specific wrinkles: on forehead, start in the middle and work out towards the temples. For the eyes, commence the movement at the side nearest the nose, and work your fingers outwards and right around the top of your eyes. Don't just massage to the outer edge of the eyes, and stop there, for that is where lines are so apt to appear.


