The general opinion was that both plans should be followed but that first attention should be directed toward Grey, as, on account of our situation, with the main watershed in the neighborhood of Dundas and a fall of some 1,200 feet to Georgian Bay, favorable results could be secured in a comparatively short time and Grey County could be used as an example to persuade other counties to fall in line.
