Farm Forum

1. Will you please give me your opinion on the value of tobacco scrap for manure purposes? The scrap I refer to is the fine dust and broken up leaves which come from the factory. This is being used some in this county as fertilizer for fruit trees, and I would be glad of any information you can give me as to its ton value. "G. G. B., Norfolk County."

Tobacco waste material is quoted as having plantfood composition as follows:

N PO. KO. Tobacco Leaves 4.00 .50 6.00 Tobacco Stalks 3,70 .65 4.50 2.50 .90 7.00 Tobacco Stems These figures would show the waste material from the tobacco plant to be of considerable value from the standpoint of Nitrogen and especially Potash.

2. I have nine acres of hay land that was seeded down in 1937 to 8 lbs, Alfalfa, 4 Red Clover, 2 Alsike and 3 of Timothy, Hay was taken off in 1938, then pastured. Could I fertilize this land to advantage this Spring for pasture? What kind of lertilizer and how much to the acre would you advise? "W. E. P., Midslesex Co."

I believe you would obtain excellent results from top-dressing your legume and grass mixture with 0-12-10 or 0-12-15 fertilizers at the rate of 250 lbs. per acre. This mixture has given excellent results in our tests. Legumes use much Potash as well as Phosphate.



CULTIVATION
