

12 Reasons Why Cars Are Pinched

New Ontario Legislation Provides For Additional Grounds For Impounding Autos

Seizure of an automobile for three months upon the operator's third conviction for driving without a license was stipulated in an amendment to the Highway Traffic Act passed by the Ontario Legislature in committee last month.

The Act was amended to provide for impounding of cars on 11 new grounds. Autos must be impounded for a first conviction for driving while the license or motor vehicle permit is under suspension by the minister of highways or by a magistrate; for operating or being in charge of a motor vehicle while intoxicated; and for driving while prohibited under the Criminal Code following conviction for reckless driving while the driver's license is under suspension.

In addition, the car must be seized and held for three months upon a second conviction for failing to remain at the scene of an accident, and for a third conviction for any one of the following offences: Operating an unregistered motor vehicle, driving without a chauffeur's license, careless driving, racing, driving while under age, or driving without an operator's license.

Asks Training For Transients

On Federal Farm; M.P. Fears Closing of the Camps in B.C.

Establishment of a training farm for unemployed transients in British Columbia under the citizens recreational council and in co-operation with the provincial government was advocated in the House of Commons last week by Howard Green, Conservative, Vancouver South.

Some 4,000 single unemployed in forestry camps in British Columbia would be dismissed June 1, Mr. Green said, and there was some apprehension as to what would become of these young men.

Mr. Green suggested establishment of a farm on an experimental basis and also training centres to prepare the men for mining, forestry and road building work.

Air Transport Becomes Safer

It Is Predicted That Within Ten Years It May Be The Safest Means of Travel

"Within 10 years at the very most, and likely within five, air transport will be the safest means of travel the world has ever known." A record in air safety was established last year, said B. B. Crag, national sales director of United Air Lines, while on a visit to Canada last week.

Fear provided the greatest resistance to the selling of air transport, the speaker pointed out. Following a series of crashes three years ago, new tactics had been employed. Up to that time those selling air transport had avoided mention of accidents in air travel.

The new tactics involved telling by word of mouth to customers of the air services, and to the general public through advertising, the reasons why there had been crashes and the steps that had been taken to prevent them. This program had resulted in new confidence.

Royalty Tastes Buffalo Steaks

Choice Dish Is Served At One of the Meals on the Royal Train.

The meat of the buffalo, once the principal fare of pioneer plainmen, is a popular repast with many Canadians who like extra flavor and novelty in their meals. Tasty buffalo steaks were served at one of the meals on the Royal train according to the Department of Resources, Ottawa, which maintains great herds of these animals in two national parks in Western Canada. Described as the noblest ruminant that ever trod the earth, the buffalo was at one time nearly extinct, but the establishment of herds in Parks saved them from this fate. Today it is necessary to reduce the herds at regular intervals to keep them within the carrying capacity of the park pastures, and from time to time periodic slaughters are carried out by contract under government supervision.

Higher Mines Tax To Benefit North

Municipal Revenues Increased By \$175,000 or More

The Town of Timmins this year should receive \$25,000 to \$29,000 added tax revenues because of a measure to amend the Assessment Act, which came before the Ontario Legislature, Mines Minister Paul Leduc estimated.

Mr. Leduc predicted Timmins, Teck Township and Tisdale Township, in which are located most of Ontario's profit-making gold mines, would together receive \$175,000 more this year from the tax on mine profits.

"The bill is an effort to help the municipalities, and it will affect only mines with profits, determined by the mine assessors under the Mining Tax Act, of \$2,333,000 or more," said the Minister.
