Guelph Drew Immense Crowds for Royal Visit

Hundreds from Durham, and South Grey were among the fifty thousand who packed Guelph streets and lined the railway tracks Tuesday to see our King and Queen. There were five special trains from the North alone, each carrying 1,000 or more, while hundreds also went by motor car. On the Durham special 589 entrained here, the greatest crowd ever to I ave here by train. These included about 200 adults, and 400 children from Durham High and Public Schools, Williamsford school (Camp. McLean, teacher), No. 3. Bentinck (H. Milligan, teacher) and a few from other schools. It was a glorious outing for the kiddies, perhaps half of whom were having their first train ride.
